

Conservation Board Impacted By County Budget Trouble



The recession that has seriously crippled the United States Economy has made it's way to the Midwest. It seems every time we pick up a local paper or turn on the news we hear about another school closing, more lay-offs, and businesses closing.

In December of 2009, the Webster County Board of Supervisors were forced to make a ten percent across the board cut in the County Budget. The Conservation Board's share of this cut was \$42,500. During the next fiscal year, the WCCB will also lose a Park Ranger Position, reduce

seasonal staff from six to three, and many needed infrastructure repairs will be put on hold. Also, the department will not be able to offer the summer paddleboat rentals.

We thank you for your past sup-

port of our programs and activities and ask for your patience and understanding as we go through this challenging time.

TRAILS, TRAILS, TRAILS...

The Conservation Dept., in partnership with the City of Fort Dodge and Trails Task Force, continues to expand recreational trails in Webster County.

The staff will start Phase III of the Badger Lake Trail. Phase III will consist of grading and rocking the final portion of this 2-mile, rock trail. Upon completion of this phase the department will topcoat the entire trail with a crushed limestone to make the trail more "user-friendly".

The city and county will bid the hard-surfaced trail from Fort Dodge to Harlan Rogers this summer. We are hoping for a fall construction of this 2.4 mile extension. A \$350,000 Transportation Grant and city/county funds will make this plan a reality. The group is applying for a

\$1 million Vision Iowa grant this summer to more than double our current trail system.

The local water trail group continues to work on the development of the Lizard Creek Water Trail. New brochures will be out this summer, thanks to the CVB & Central Iowa Tourism!!


Building a Natural Playscape
