

City Wide Pavement Evaluations Completed in 2019

Every three years the City of Yelm completes an evaluation of the condition of the 39.5 miles of city-maintained pavement. Cracking, potholes and bumps in the road are almost impossible to prevent, but by completing these evaluations the City is better able to maintain them. The evaluation that was done last year was to determine short-term maintenance, plan for roadway rehabilitation and reconstruction work, and to determine which capital projects are of the highest priority. In order to have the most thorough evaluations possible, the City uses a Pavement Condition Index (PCI), which provides a score ranging from 0 to 100 for each segment of road evaluated. These evaluations are completed by StreetScan and funding is provided through the City's Road and Street Construction Fund.
