CITY OF YELM REQUEST FOR STATEMENT OF QUALIFICATIONS PROFESSIONAL SERVICES Longmire Park Upgrades

I. PURPOSE OF REQUEST

The City of Yelm ("City") is soliciting statements of qualifications and performance data from qualified professionals to produce complete plans, specifications, and estimates for the City of Yelm Longmire Park Upgrades project. The firm selected to perform this work will enter into a Professional Services Agreement (PSA) with the City.

II. PROJECT DESCRIPTION AND BACKGROUND

The Longmire Park Upgrades project is a capital improvement project that will feature synthetic turf for three softball fields, and a football/soccer field. A key element to this project will be addressing the drainage needs that the park will need to accommodate the turf. Some other aspects we would like to include are upgrades to the backstops of the soft ball fields, new or upgraded dugouts, new goal posts and a score board for the football field as well as lighting for all four fields of play. The goal is to make the Longmire Park fields available for play in any type of weather and a destination for local ball clubs.

In 2019 Hatton Godat Pantier, Inc. designed drainage improvements for Field 2 and the north end of the football field. This project was constructed by Swofford Excavating LLC in mid-2020 and has worked quite well. Full plans, specifications, and as built for this work are attached.

- A. Please email your SOQ to the email address indicated above. Hard copies are not desired. No faxed or telephone statements will be accepted.
- B. All SOQs must be received by **5:00 PM on March 13, 2024**.
- C. SOQs should be prepared simply and economically, providing a straightforward, concise description of provider capabilities to satisfy the requirements of the request. Emphasis should be on completeness and clarity of content. A minimum of 10-point font shall be used.
- D. Any questions concerning the City's specifications or request process shall be directed to Brad Chatwood, Public Services Projects & Programs Manager.
- E. All SOQs must include the following information:
 - The names of individuals from those firms who will be working on the project or discipline(s) of the project and their area(s) of responsibility.

V. SELECTION CRITERIA

Firms will be evaluated and ranked based on the following criteria:

- B. Firm experience with City of Yelm or other municipalities plans, specifications, and estimates ("PS&E").
- C. Past performance in successfully completing projects of this type, and meeting projected deadlines and budget.
- D. Familiarity with relevant codes and standards.
- E. References

VI. TERMS AND CONDITIONS

- A. The City reserves the right to reject any and all SOQs, and to waive minor irregularities in any SOQ.
- B. The City reserves the right to request clarification of information submitted, and to request additional information from any firm.
- C. The City reserves the right to award any contract to the next most qualified firm, if the successful firm does not execute a PSA within thirty (30) days after the selection of the firm.
- D. Any SOQ may be withdrawn up until the date and time set above for the deadline for submittal of the SOQs. Any SOQ not so timely withdrawn shall constitute an irrevocable offer, for a period of ninety (90) days to provide to the City the services described in the attached specifications, or until one or more of the SOQs have been approved by the City administration, whichever occurs first.
- E. The PSA resulting from acceptance of a SOQ by the City shall be in a form supplied or approved by the City, and shall reflect the specifications in this Request. A copy of the City's standard PSA is available for review upon request.
- F. The City shall not be responsible for any costs incurred by the firm in preparing, submitting or presenting its response to the Request.
- G. The City of Yelm, in accordance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 78 Stat. 252, 42 U.S.C. 2000d to 2000d-4 and Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations, Department of Transportation, subtitle A, Office of the Secretary, Part 21, nondiscrimination in federally assisted programs of the Department of Transportation issued pursuant to such Act, hereby notifies all bidders that it will affirmatively ensure that in any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, disadvantaged business enterprises as defined at 49 CFR Part 26 will be afforded full opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, national origin, or sex in consideration for an award.

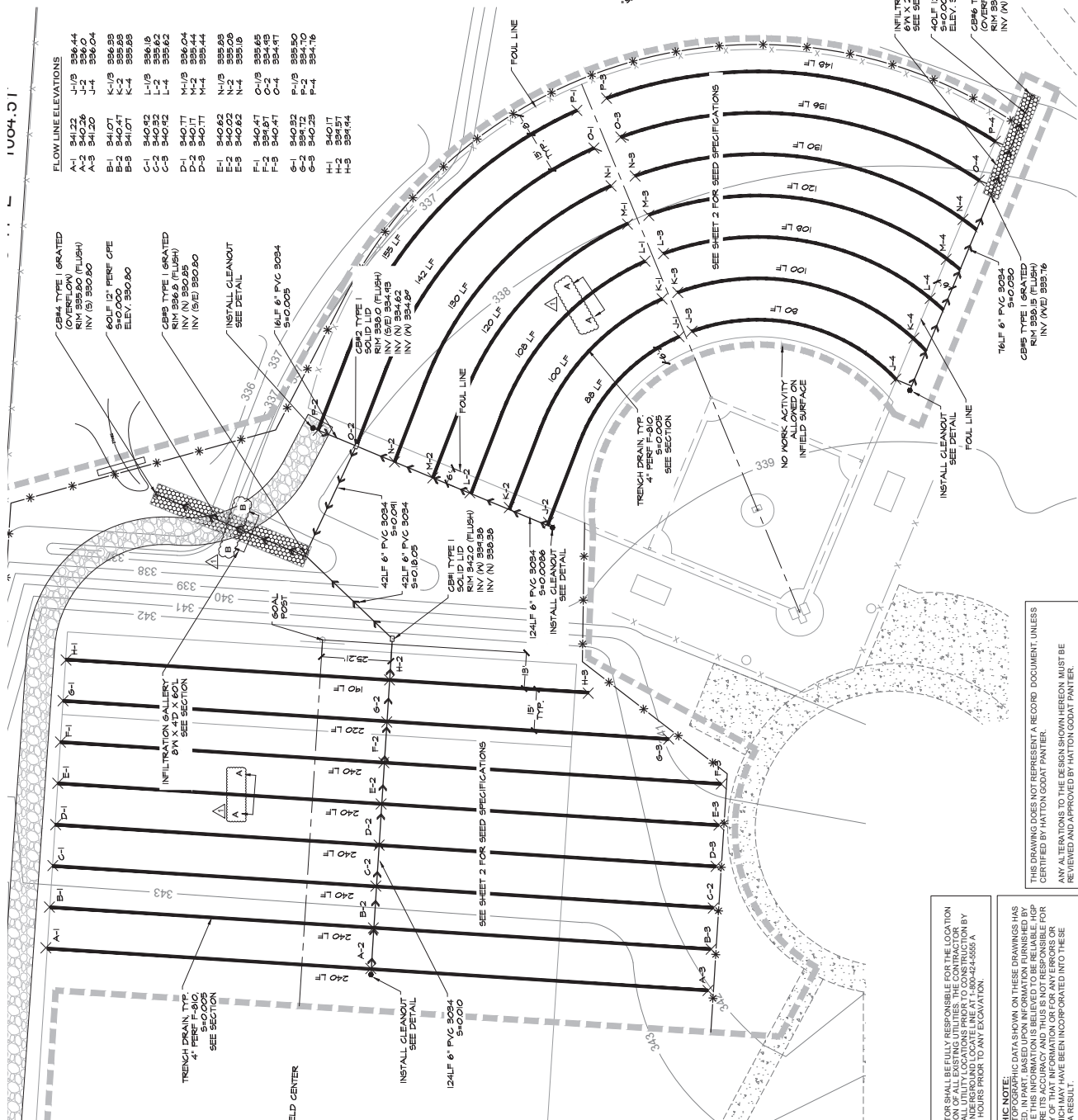

Notice is hereby given that the City of Yelm, Washington, will receive sealed bids through June 19th, 2020, until 2:00 p.m., at the City Hall Purchasing Office or by US Mail at City of Yelm, Purchasing Office, 106 Second St SE, Yelm, WA 98597. Proposals received after 2:00 p.m. on said date will not be considered.

All bids will be opened and read publicly aloud at 2:30 p.m. on June 19th, 2020, at City Hall Council Chambers 106 Second St SE, Yelm WA 98597, for this RFB.

All bid proposals shall be accompanied by a bid deposit by a cashier's or certified check, or Bid Bond in an amount equal to five percent (5%) of the amount of such bid proposal. Should the successful bidder fail to enter into a contract and furnish satisfactory Performance Bond within the time stated in the specifications, the bid deposit or bond shall be forfeited to the City of Yelm.

This Contract provides for drainage improvements on athletic field surfaces in Longmire City Park. Work will consist of temporary erosion control, installation of a shallow trench-drainage network and infiltration galleries, placement of sand/soil mixture, fine grading and seeding field surfaces.

The Contractor shall complete all work within 47 working days. **Physical work shall begin no earlier than July 15th, 2020 and no later than August 31, 2020.**

The estimated construction cost is \$180,000 to 200,000.

All bid proposals shall be in accordance with the Instructions to Bidders and all other contract documents. Any questions concerning the description of the work contained in the contract documents must be directed in written form only to Derek M. McCoy, PE, by email at derekm@yelmwa.gov.

Contract Documents for bidding including Project Presentation, Project Manual, and Addendums may be viewed free of charge, through the Builders Exchange of Washington, www.bxwa.com, and clicking posted projects, public works, and city of yelm.

The City, in accordance with Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, 78 Stat. 252, 42 U.S.C. 2000d to 2000d-4 and Title 49 C.F.R., Department of Transportation, Subtitle A, Office of the Secretary, Part 21, Nondiscrimination in Federally-assisted programs of the Department of Transportation issued pursuant to such Act, hereby notifies all bidders that it will affirmatively ensure that in any contract entered into pursuant to this advertisement, disadvantaged business enterprises as defined at 49 CFR Part 23 will be afforded full opportunity to submit bids in response to this invitation and will not be discriminated against on the grounds of race, color, national origin, or sex in consideration for an award. The City encourages minority and women-owned firms to submit bids consistent with the City's policy to ensure that such firms are afforded the maximum practicable opportunity to compete for and obtain public contracts.

The Contractor will be required to comply with all local, State, and Federal laws and regulations pertaining to equal employment opportunities.

The City of Yelm reserves the right to reject any and all bids, waive any informalities or minor irregularities in the bidding, and determine which bid or bidder meets the criteria set forth in the bid documents. No bidder may withdraw his bid after the hour set for the opening thereof unless the award is delayed for a period exceeding thirty (30) days.

INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

SECTION 1: INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

1-1 Time and Place for Submission and Opening of Bids

Sealed bids must be submitted by 2:00 p.m. local time on June 19th, 2020, to the Purchasing Office of the City of Yelm (the "City"), located at City Hall, or received by US Mail at City of Yelm, 106 Second St SE, and will be publicly opened and read aloud in City Hall Council Chambers on June 19th, 2020, at that time.

The City's Purchasing Coordinator must receive the sealed bid **before the time and date specified** in order to be considered. Telex or facsimile bids will not be accepted. The bidder accepts all risks of late delivery of mailed bids or of mis-delivery regardless of fault. Late bids will be returned unopened.

1-2 Bid Form

Bids shall be made on the "Bid Form" issued by the City as part of these contract documents, without reservation or amendment. Bids must be typewritten or printed in ink. Upon completion, the Bid Form and the bid bond or certified check and any requested information shall be placed in a sealed envelope. On the outside of the envelope, place the bid name, bid number and the time bids are due.

1-3 Bid Signature

All bids shall give the total bid price and shall be signed in ink by the bidder or their authorized representative, with the address. If the bid is made by an individual, the name, signature, and address must be shown. If the bid is made by a firm or partnership, the name and address of the firm or partnership and the signature of at least one of the general partners must be shown. If the bid is made by a corporation, the bid shall show the title of the person authorized to sign on behalf of the corporation, his or her title and the address. The City reserves the right to request documentation showing the authority of the individual signing the bid to execute contracts on behalf of anyone, or any entity, other than himself/herself. Refusal to provide such information upon request may cause the bid to be rejected as nonresponsive.

1-4 Bid Withdrawal Due to Error

Bids may not be withdrawn due to a claim of error in a bid unless written notice of such claim and supporting evidence for such claim including cost breakdown sheets are delivered to the City within forty-eight (48) hours prior to the opening of bids.

1-5 Modification of Bid

A modification of a bid already received will be considered only if the modification is received prior to the time announced for bid opening. All modifications shall be made in writing, executed and submitted in the same form and manner as the original bid.

1-6 Examination of Bid and Contract Documents – Bidder Responsibilities

The submission of a bid shall constitute an acknowledgment upon which the City may rely that the bidder has thoroughly examined and is familiar with the bid and contract documents and has reviewed and inspected all applicable federal, state and local statutes, regulations, ordinances and resolutions dealing with or related to the equipment and/or services to be provided herein. The failure or neglect of a bidder to examine such documents, statutes, regulations, ordinances or resolutions shall in no way relieve the bidder from any obligations with respect to the bidder's bid or the contract documents. No claim for additional compensation will be allowed which is based upon a lack of knowledge of any contract documents, statutes, regulations, ordinances or resolutions. Bidders shall visit delivery and service locations(s) as required. Bidders shall become familiar with and verify any environmental factors, which may impact current or future prices for this requirement.

1-7 Interpretation of Bid and Contract Documents

No oral interpretations will be made to any bidder as to the meaning of the bid or contract documents and no oral communications will be binding upon the City. Requests for an interpretation shall be made by facsimile, or by mail and delivered to the Purchasing Coordinator of the City at the address indicated in Section 1-1, at least ten (10) days before the date announced for opening the bids. Any interpretation deemed necessary by the City will be in the form of an addendum to the bid documents and when issued will be sent as promptly as is practical to all parties to whom the bid documents have been issued. All such addenda shall become part of the bid.

1-8 Addenda

Each bid shall include acknowledgment of receipt and review of all addenda issued during the bidding period on the Bid Form.

1-9 Bid Price

The bid price shall include everything necessary for the completion of the contract including, but not limited to, furnishing all materials, equipment, tools, freight charges, facilities and all management, superintendence, labor and service, except as may be provided otherwise in the contract documents. **All Washington State sales tax and all other government taxes, assessments and charges shall be included in the various Bid item prices as required by law.** The offer shall remain in effect ninety (90) days after the bid opening. In the event of a discrepancy between a unit price and an extended amount and/or the total price, the unit price will govern and the extended amount and/or total price will be corrected accordingly. However, downward correction of a bid, which would displace the apparent low bidder, will only be permitted if the error made and the intended bid price can be determined solely from the bid documents.

1-10 Postponement of Bid Opening

The City reserves the right to postpone the date and time for the opening of bids by announcing such postponement at any time prior to the date and time announced in these documents.

1-11 Rejection of Bids

- A. The City reserves the right to reject any bid for any reason including, but not limited to, the following: any bid which is incomplete, obscure, irregular or lacking necessary detail and specificity; any bid which omits a price on any one or more items on the Bid Form and Bid Schedule; any bid in which prices are unbalanced in the opinion of the City; any bid accompanied by insufficient or irregular bid bond; any bid from bidders who (in the sole judgment of the City) lack the qualifications and/or responsibility necessary to perform the work after considering the elements in Section 1-14.B; any bid for which a bidder fails or neglects to complete and submit any qualifications information within the time specified by the City and as may be otherwise required herein; and, any bid submitted by a bidder who is not registered or licensed as may be required by the laws of the State of Washington.
- B. The City further reserves **the right to reject any portion of any bid and/or to reject all bids.** In consideration for the City's review and evaluation of its bid, the bidder waives and releases any claims against the City arising from any rejection of any or all bids.

1-12 Alterations to Documents Prohibited

Any addition, limitation or provision attached to the bid may render it informal or nonresponsive and cause its rejection. Alteration by erasure or interlineations must be explained or noted in the bid form over the signature of the bidder. No oral, telegraphic or telephonic bids or modifications will be considered.

1-13 Disqualification of Bidder

If, in the opinion of the City, there is reason to believe that collusion exists among bidders, none of the bids of the participants in such collusion will be considered. All bidders are required to submit the Affidavit of Non-Collusion with their bids.

1-14 Evaluation of Bids

It is the intent of City to award a contract to the lowest responsive bid by a responsible bidder as evaluated by the City. The bidder may be required by the City to submit documentation demonstrating compliance with the criteria.

- A. Responsiveness – The bidder must complete all required forms and bid documents and provide all required and requested information. Refusal to provide such information may cause the bid to be rejected. The City will consider all the material submitted by the bidder to determine whether the bid is in compliance with the bid terms and documents and responsive to the requested work.
- B. Responsibility – The City will consider all the material submitted by the bidder, and other evidence it may obtain including information from previous project owners, to determine whether the bidder is responsible. The bidder must meet the following bidder responsibility criteria and supplemental bidder responsibility criteria to be considered a responsible bidder:

1. Mandatory Bidder Responsibility Criteria
 - a. Have a current certificate of registration as a contractor in compliance with chapter 18.27 RCW, which must have been in effect at the time of bid submittal;
 - b. Have a current Washington Unified Business Identifier (UBI) number;
 - c. If applicable:
 - i. Have Industrial Insurance (workers' compensation) coverage for the bidder's employees working in Washington, as required in Title 51 RCW;
 - ii. Have a Washington Employment Security Department number, as required in Title 50 RCW;
 - iii. Have a Washington Department of Revenue state excise tax registration number, as required in Title 82 RCW;
 - d. Not be disqualified from bidding on any public works contract under RCW 39.06.010 or 39.12.065(3).
2. Supplemental Bidder Responsibility Criteria
 - a. The bidder shall not have a record of excessive claims filed against the retainage, payment, or performance bonds for public works projects during the previous three years, that demonstrate a lack of effective management by the bidder of making timely and appropriate payments to its subcontractors, suppliers, and workers, unless there are extenuating circumstances acceptable to the City.
 - b. The bidder shall have a reasonable history of successfully completed projects of a similar size and scope as required by the contract documents for this project. The City will evaluate whether the projects were "successfully completed" and of a "similar size and scope."
 - c. The bidder shall have evidence that it is able to begin and complete the work, and complete it in a timely fashion.
2. As evidence that the bidder meets the supplemental bidder responsibility criteria in paragraph (B)(2) above, the apparent low bidder must submit the following documentation to the City within 48 hours of the bid opening. The City reserves the right to request such documentation from other bidders also. Refusal to provide such information upon request may cause the bid to be rejected.
 - a. The bidder shall submit a list of the public works projects completed within the previous three years and include for each project the following information; the owner and contact information for the owner; a list of claims filed against the retainage, payment, or performance bond for any of the projects listed; a written explanation of the circumstances surrounding each claim and the ultimate resolution of the claim.
 - b. The bidder shall submit a list of projects of similar size and scope to this project and include information about each project, including the following: the owner and contact information for the owner; the awarded contract amount; the final contract amount; a description of the scope of the project and how the project is similar to this project; the bidder's assessment of its performance of each project. The information should include any information regarding performance in the following areas; quality control; safety record; timeliness of performance; use of skilled personnel; management of subcontractors; availability of and use

- of appropriate equipment; compliance with contract documents; management of submittals process, change orders, and close-out.
 - c. The bidder shall furnish acceptable evidence of the bidder's current ability to perform, such as firm commitments by subcontractors, equipment, supplies and facilities, and the bidder's ability to obtain the necessary personnel.
 - d. The bidder shall obtain a City of Yelm Business Registration. The registration may be obtained at: <http://dor.wa.gov>.
4. If the City determines the bidder does not meet the bidder responsibility criteria in paragraph (B)(2) above and is therefore not a responsible bidder, the City shall notify the bidder in writing with the reasons for its determination. If the bidder disagrees with this determination, it may appeal the determination within 24 hours of receipt of the City's determination by presenting additional information to the City and meeting the requirements of section 1-20(B). The City will consider the additional information before issuing its final determination. If the final determination affirms that the bidder is not responsible, the City will not execute a contract with any other bidder until two business days after the bidder determined to be not responsible has received the final determination.
- C. Lowest Bid – The lowest bid shall be determined as set forth on the Bid Form.

The acceptance of a bid will be evidenced by a Notice of Award. No other act of the City shall constitute acceptance of a bid. Within ten (10) days after receipt of Notice of Award, the bidder whose bid is accepted, shall furnish the required performance bond, certificate of insurance, execute the contract and perform all other acts required by the bid and contract documents as conditions precedent to formation of the contract.

1-15 Procedures When Only One Bid is Received

In the event only a single responsive bid is received, the City reserves the right to conduct a price and/or cost analysis of such bid. The sole bidder shall provide such information, data and other documentation as deemed necessary by the City for such analysis. The City reserves the right to reject such bid.

1-16 Bid Documents

Bidders are required to submit with the bid package the following:

- A. Bid Form
- B. Bid Proposal Sheet
- C. Bid Signature Page
- D. Bid Bond Form
- E. Subcontractor List

F. Contractor Certification of Wage Law Compliance

G. Non-Collusion Declaration

1-17 Conflicts of Interest and Noncompetitive Practices

By submitting a bid, the Contractor agrees as follows:

A. Conflict of Interest – That it has no direct or indirect pecuniary or proprietary interest, that it shall not acquire any interest which conflicts in any manner or degree with the work, services, equipment or materials required to be performed and/or provided under this contract and that it shall not employ any person or agent having any such interests. In the event that the Contractor or its agents, employees or representatives hereafter acquires such a conflict of interest, it shall immediately disclose such interest to the City and take action immediately to eliminate the conflict or to withdraw from this contract, as the City may require.

B. Contingent Fees and Gratuities

1. That no person or selling agency except bona fide employees or designated agents or representatives of the Contractor have been employed or retained to solicit or secure this contract with an agreement or understanding that a commission, percentage, brokerage, or contingent fee would be paid; and
2. That no gratuities in the form of entertainment, gifts or otherwise, were offered or given by the Contractor or any of its agents, employees or representatives, to any official, member or employee of the City or other governmental agency with a view toward securing this contract or securing favorable treatment with respect to the awarding or amending, or the making of any determination with respect to the performance of this contract.

1-18 Bid Security

No bid will be considered unless accompanied by either a cashier's or certified check in an amount equal to five percent (5%) of the Total Bid Price as indicated on "**Bid Form**", or a letter of credit for a like amount. The check or bond shall be payable to the City; it shall be forfeited as fixed and liquidated damages in case the bidder fails, neglects or refuses to enter into a contract for the faithful performance of said work (including the providing of any evidence of insurance and/or performance bond required herein), in the event the contract is awarded to them, within ten (10) days after the award is made. If a bid bond is submitted in lieu of a check, it shall be executed by a corporate surety authorized to transact business in the State of Washington and "Bid Bond". If a letter of credit is offered in lieu of a check or bidder's bond, it shall be issued as an irrevocable documentary letter of credit drawn on a banking institution licensed to do business in the State of Washington. The letter of credit shall include instruction and provisions prescribed in "Bid Bond". Any questions as to the qualification of the banking institution or instruction shall be submitted to the City at least ten (10) days prior to the bid submittal date. The check, bidder's bond or letter of credit shall be attached to the bid form.

The City further reserves the right to hold all bids (and the accompanying bid security) from the date of the bid opening until the contract and any performance/payment bond are executed, provided that such period does not exceed ninety (90) days, and each bid shall remain effective during that period.

1-19 Performance/Payment Bond

The bidder to whom the City has awarded this Contract will remove the Performance/Payment Bond attached to the Public Works Contract and deliver it to the City fully executed by the bidder and a surety company in the amount of one hundred percent (100%) of the contract price as security for the faithful performance of the work including the payment of all persons furnishing materials and performing labor on the work and all payments arising from the performance of the work due the State of Washington pursuant to Titles 50 and 51 RCW. Such bond must be executed by a duly licensed surety company, which is registered with the Washington State Insurance Commissioner, and the surety's name shall appear in the current Authorized Insurance Company List in the State of Washington, published by the Office of the Insurance Commissioner. The City may require the surety company to appear and qualify itself upon the bond. If, at any time, the City determines in its sole judgment that the surety company is insufficient, the City may require the Contractor to furnish additional surety in form and arrangement satisfactory to the City and in an amount not exceeding that originally required. The Contractor shall submit a performance bond complying with the requirements of this paragraph within ten (10) days after the award is made. Payments will not be made on the Contract until sufficient surety as required is furnished.

1-20 Bid Dispute

- A. Any actual or prospective bidder, including sub-contractors and suppliers showing a substantial economic interest in this contract who is aggrieved in connection with the solicitation or award of this contract, may protest to the City in accordance with the procedures set forth herein. Protests based on the specifications or other terms in the contract documents, which are apparent prior to the date established for submittal of bids, shall be submitted not later than ten (10) calendar days prior to said date, or shall be deemed waived. All other protests shall be accepted only from actual bidders and shall be submitted within five (5) calendar days after the aggrieved person knows or should have known of the facts and circumstances upon which the protest is based; provided, however, that in no event shall a protest be considered if all bids are rejected or after the award of this contract.
- B. In order to be considered, a protest shall be in writing and shall include: (1) the name and address of the aggrieved person; (2) the RFB number and contract title under which the protest is submitted; (3) a detailed description of the specific grounds for protest and any supporting documentation; and (4) the specific ruling or relief requested. - C. Upon receipt of a written protest, the City will promptly consider the protest. The City may give notice of the protest and its basis to other persons, including bidders involved in or affected by the protest; such other persons may be given an opportunity to submit their views and relevant information. If the protest is not resolved by mutual agreement of the aggrieved person and the City, the City will promptly issue a decision in writing stating the reasons for the action taken and informing the aggrieved person of his or her right to appeal the decision to the Mayor or his or her designee. A copy of the decision shall be mailed (by certified mail, return receipt requested) or otherwise promptly furnished to the aggrieved person and any other interested parties who requested a copy of the decision. The decision will be considered final and conclusive unless appealed within five (5) calendar days after receipt of the decision to the Mayor or his or her designee. If the decision is appealed, then the subsequent determination of the Mayor or his or her designee shall issue within five (5) days of the Mayor's receipt of the appeal and shall be final and conclusive.
- D. Failure to comply with these protest procedures will render a protest untimely or inadequate and shall result in rejection thereof by the City.

THIS PUBLIC WORKS CONTRACT ("Contract") is dated effective this _____ day of _____, 200__ and is made by and between the City of Yelm, a Washington municipal corporation ("City or Owner"), and _____, a _____ ("Contractor").

A. The City desires to retain an independent contractor to furnish all labor and materials necessary to perform work necessary to provide for safety improvements throughout the City of Yelm by replacing identified sections of sidewalk that present tripping hazards and or limited protection from adjacent traffic; and

B. The Contractor has the requisite skill and experience to perform such work.

NOW, THEREFORE, the parties ("Parties") agree to the following terms and conditions:

1. SERVICES BY CONTRACTOR

1.1 Description of Work. Contractor shall perform all work and furnish all tools, materials, supplies, equipment, labor and other items incidental thereto necessary for the construction and completion of the work, more particularly described as the **LONGMIRE DRAINAGE IMPROVEMENTS** project, including without limitation:

installation of perforated trench drains, drain rock, solid drainpipes and structures, rock-filled infiltration galleries, placement of sand/soil mixture and fine grading of same on athletic surfaces, seeding, and installation/maintenance/removal of temporary erosion control measures,

("Work"), in accordance with and as described in the Contract Documents, which include without limitation, this Contract, Request for Bids, Bidder's Checklist, Instructions to Bidders, General Contractual Terms and Conditions, Bid Form, Bid Signature Page, Bid Bond, Combined Affidavit and Certification Form, Contractor's Compliance Statement, Notice of Completion of Public Works Contract attached as Exhibit A, Contract Change Order Agreement attached as Exhibit B, Contractor's Retainage Agreement attached as Exhibit C, Retainage Bond to City of Yelm Way attached as Exhibit D, Notice to Labor Unions or Other Employment Organizations Nondiscrimination in Employment attached as Exhibit E, Certificate(s) of Insurance Form attached hereto as Exhibit F, Performance / Payment Bond attached hereto as Exhibit G, Title VI Assurances attached hereto as Exhibit H, Standard Plans and Details attached as Appendix A, current Prevailing Wage Rates attached as Appendix B, Warranties attached as Appendix C, and 2020 WSDOT / APWA Standard Specifications for Road, Bridge and Municipal Construction ("Standard Specifications") and all other Appendices attached hereto and incorporated by this reference, (collectively the "Contract Documents"), which Work shall be completed to the City's satisfaction, within the time period prescribed by the City and pursuant to the direction of the Mayor or his or her designee.

1.2 Completion Date. The Work shall be commenced within five (5) days of receipt by the Contractor of the City's Notice to Proceed. The Work shall be completed in 47 working days. In the event the Work is not substantially completed within the time specified, Contractor agrees to pay to the City liquidated damages in the amount set forth in the formula included in Section 1.3 of this Contract. The

Work shall not be deemed completed until the City has accepted the Work and delivered a written Notice of Completion of Public Works Contract in the form attached hereto as Exhibit "A".

1.3 Liquidated Damages. Time is of the essence of the Contract. Delays inconvenience the public and cost taxpayers undue sums of money, adding time needed for administration, inspection, and supervision. It is impractical for the City to calculate the actual cost of delays. Accordingly, the Contractor agrees to pay liquidated damages calculated on the following formula for its failure to complete this Contract on time:

(1) To pay (according to the following formula) liquidated damages for each working day beyond the number of working days established for completion, and

(2) To authorize the City to deduct these liquidated damages from any money due or coming due to the Contractor.

LIQUIDATED DAMAGES FORMULA

$$LD = \frac{0.15C}{T}$$

Where: LD = Liquidated damages per working day (rounded to the nearest dollar).
C = Original Contract amount.
T = Original time for completion.

When the Work is completed to the extent that the City has full and unrestricted use and benefit of the facilities, both from an operational and safety standpoint, the City may determine the Work is complete. Liquidated damages will not be assessed for any days for which an extension of time is granted. No deduction or payment of liquidated damages will, in any degree, release the Contractor from further obligations and liabilities to complete this entire Contract.

1.4 Performance Standard. Contractor shall perform the Work in a manner consistent with accepted practices for other properly licensed contractors.

1.5 Compliance with Laws. Contractor shall perform the Work in accordance with all applicable federal, state and City laws, including but not limited to all City ordinances, resolutions, standards or policies, as now existing or hereafter adopted or amended, and obtain all necessary permits and pay all permit, inspection or other fees, at its sole cost and expense.

1.6 Change Orders. The City may, at any time, without notice to sureties, order changes within the scope of the Work. Contractor agrees to fully perform any such alterations or additions to the Work. All such change orders shall be in the form of the Contract Change Order Agreement attached hereto as Exhibit "B", which shall be signed by both the Contractor and the City, shall specifically state the change of the Work, the completion date for such changed Work, and any increase or decrease in the compensation to be paid to Contractor as a result of such change in the Work. Oral change orders shall not be binding upon the City unless confirmed in writing by the City. If any change hereunder causes an increase or decrease in the Contractor's cost of, or time required for, the performance or any part of the Work under this Contract, an equitable adjustment will be made and the Contract modified in writing accordingly.

If the Contractor intends to assert a claim for an equitable adjustment hereunder, it shall, within five (5) days after receipt of a written change order from the City or after giving the written notice required above, as the case may be, submit to the City a written statement setting forth the general nature and monetary extent of such claim; provided the City, in its sole discretion, may extend such five (5) day submittal period upon request by the Contractor. The Contractor shall supply such supporting documents and analysis for the claims as the City may require to determine if the claims and costs have merit. No claim will be allowed for any costs incurred more than five (5) days before the Contractor gives written notice as required. No claim by the Contractor for an equitable adjustment hereunder will be allowed if asserted after final payment under this Contract.

1.7 Work and Materials Omitted. The Contractor shall, when directed in writing by the City, omit work, services and materials to be furnished under the Contract and the value of the omitted work and materials will be deducted from the Total Compensation and the delivery schedule will be reviewed if appropriate. The value of the omitted work, services and materials will be a lump sum or unit price, as mutually agreed upon in writing by the Contractor and the City. If the parties cannot agree on an appropriate deduction, the City reserves the right to issue a unilateral change order adjusting the price and the delivery schedule.

1.8 Utility Location. Contractor is responsible for locating any underground utilities affected by the Work and is deemed to be an excavator for purposes of Chapter 19.122 RCW, as amended. Contractor shall be responsible for compliance with Chapter 19.122 RCW, including utilization of the "one call" locator system before commencing any excavation activities.

1.9 Air Environment. Contractor shall fully cover any and all loads of loose construction materials including without limitation, sand, dirt, gravel, asphalt, excavated materials, construction debris, etc., to protect said materials from air exposure and to minimize emission of airborne particles to the ambient air environment within the City of Yelm Way.

2. TERM

This Contract shall commence on the effective date of this Contract and continue until the completion of the Work, , and the expiration of all warranties contained in the Contract Documents ("Term").

3. WARRANTY

3.1 Requisite Skill. The Contractor warrants that it has the requisite skill to complete the Work, and is appropriately accredited and licensed by all applicable agencies and governmental entities, including but not limited to being registered to do business in the City of Yelm Way by obtaining a City of Yelm Way business registration. Contractor represents that it has visited the site and is familiar with all of the plans and specifications in connection with the completion of the Work.

3.2 Defective Work. The Contractor shall, at its sole cost and expense, correct all Work which the City deems to have defects in workmanship and material discovered within one (1) year after the City's final acceptance of the Work as more fully set forth in the General Conditions of the Contract; provided, however, that this warranty may extend beyond this time period pursuant to the warranties attached hereto as Appendix C and incorporated by this reference. This warranty shall survive termination

of this Contract. Conducting of tests and inspections, review of specifications or plans, payment for goods or services, or acceptance by the City does not constitute waiver, modification or exclusion of any express or implied warranty or any right under this Contract or law.

4. COMPENSATION

4.1 Total Compensation. In consideration of the Contractor performing the Work, the City agrees to pay the Contractor an amount not to exceed _____ and 00/100 Dollars (\$ _____), which amount shall constitute full and complete payment by the City ("Total Compensation").

4.2 Contractor Responsible for Taxes. The Contractor shall be solely responsible for the payment of any taxes imposed by any lawful jurisdiction as a result of the performance and payment of this Contract.

4.3 Nonpayment. The City shall have the right to withhold payment to the Contractor for any of the Work not completed in a satisfactory manner, in the City's sole discretion, which shall be withheld until such time as Contractor modifies or repairs the Work so that the Work is acceptable to the City.

4.4 Method of Payment. The basis of payment will be the actual quantities of work performed according to the contract and as specified for payment. Payments will be made for work and labor performed and materials furnished under the contract according to the price in the proposal unless otherwise provided. Partial payments will be made once each month, based on partial estimates prepared by the Engineer and signed by the Contractor. Failure to perform any obligation under this Contract may be adequate reason for the City to withhold payments until the obligation is performed.

Upon completion of all work and after final inspection, the amount due the Contractor under the contract will be paid based upon the final estimate made by the Engineer and signed by the Contractor.

Payment to the Contractor for partial estimates, final estimates, and retained percentages shall be subject to controlling laws.

4.5 Retainage. Pursuant to Chapter 60.28 RCW, five percent (5%) of the Total Compensation shall be retained by the City to assure payment of Contractor's state sales tax as well as payment of subcontractors, suppliers and laborers. Upon execution of this Contract, Contractor shall complete, execute and deliver to the City the Contractor Retainage Agreement attached hereto as Exhibit "C" or execute the Retainage Bond attached hereto as Exhibit "D". No payments shall be made by the City from the retained percentage fund ("Fund") nor shall the City release any retained percentage escrow account to any person, until the City has received from the Department of Revenue a certificate that all taxes, increases, and penalties due from the Contractor and all taxes due and to become due with respect to the Contract have been paid in full or that they are, in the Department's opinion, readily collectible without recourse to the State's lien on the retained percentage. Upon non-payment by the general contractor, any supplier or subcontractor may file a lien against the retainage funds, pursuant to Chapter 60.28 RCW. Subcontractors or suppliers are required to give notice of any lien within forty-five (45) days of the completion of the Work and in the manner provided in RCW 39.08.030. Within sixty (60) days after completion of all Work on this Contract, the City shall release and pay in full the money held in the Fund, unless the City becomes aware of outstanding claims made against this Fund.

5. EQUAL OPPORTUNITY EMPLOYER

In all Contractor services, programs or activities, and all Contractor hiring and employment made possible by or resulting from this Contract, there shall be no discrimination by Contractor or by Contractor's employees, agents, subcontractors or representatives against any person because of sex, age (except minimum age and retirement provisions), race, color, creed, national origin, marital status or the presence of any disability, including sensory, mental or physical handicaps, unless based upon a bona fide occupational qualification in relationship to hiring and employment, advertising, layoff or termination, rates of pay or other forms of compensation, and selection for training, including apprenticeship. Contractor comply with and shall not violate any of the terms of Chapter 49.60 RCW, Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, the Americans With Disabilities Act, Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, 49 CFR Part 26, or any other applicable federal, state, or local law or regulation regarding non-discrimination. Any material violation of this provision shall be grounds for termination of this Contract by the City and, in the case of the Contractor's breach, may result in ineligibility for further City agreements. If this project involves federal funds including USDOT funds administered by WSDOT, the contractor agrees to the clauses contained in Exhibit H.

6. INDEPENDENT CONTRACTOR/CONFLICT OF INTEREST

6.1 It is the intention and understanding of the Parties that the Contractor shall be an independent contractor and that the City shall be neither liable nor obligated to pay Contractor sick leave, vacation pay or any other benefit of employment, nor to pay any social security or other tax which may arise as an incident of employment. The Contractor shall pay all income and other taxes due. Industrial or any other insurance that is purchased for the benefit of the City, regardless of whether such may provide a secondary or incidental benefit to the Contractor, shall not be deemed to convert this Agreement to an employment contract. It is recognized that Contractor may or will be performing professional services during the Term for other parties; provided, however, that such performance of other services shall not conflict with or interfere with Contractor's ability to perform the Services. Contractor agrees to resolve any such conflicts of interest in favor of the City.

6.2 If the Contractor is a sole proprietorship or if this is a contract with an individual, the contractor agrees to notify the City and complete any required form if the Contractor retired under a State of Washington retirement system and agrees to indemnify any losses the City may sustain through the Contractor's failure to do so.

7. CITY'S RIGHT TO TERMINATE CONTRACT

7.1 Termination Without Cause. Prior to the expiration of the Term, this Contract may be terminated without cause upon oral or written notice delivered to Contractor from the City. Upon termination, all supplies, materials, labor and/or equipment furnished prior to such date shall, at the City's option, become its property. In the event Contractor is not in breach of any of the provisions of this Contract, Contractor will be paid for any portion of the Work which has been completed to the City's satisfaction, calculated by the percentage amount that portion of the Work completed and accepted by the City bears to the Total Compensation.

7.2 Termination For Cause. The City may immediately terminate this Contract, take possession of the Property and all materials thereon and finish the Work by whatever methods it may deem expedient, upon the occurrence of any one or more of the following events:

- (1) If the Contractor should be adjudged a bankrupt.
- (2) If the Contractor should make a general assignment for the benefit of its creditors.
- (3) If a receiver should be appointed on the account of insolvency of Contractor.
- (4) If Contractor should persistently or repeatedly refuse or fail to supply a sufficient number of properly skilled workmen or proper materials for completion of the Work.
- (5) If the Contractor should fail to complete the Work within the time specified in this Contract.
- (6) If the Contractor should fail to complete the Work in compliance with the plans and specifications, to the City's satisfaction.
- (7) If the Contractor should fail to make prompt payment to subcontractors or for material labor.
- (8) If Contractor should persistently disregard laws, ordinances or regulations of federal, state, or municipal agencies or subdivisions thereof.
- (9) If Contractor should persistently disregard instructions of the Mayor or his or her representative.
- (10) If Contractor shall be in breach or violation of any term or provision of this Contract, or
- (11) If the Work is not being performed pursuant to RCW 49.28.050 or 49.28.060.

7.3 Result of Termination. In the event that this Contract is terminated for cause by the City, the City may do any or all of the following:

- (1) Stop payments. The City shall cease any further payments to Contractor and Contractor shall be obligated to repay any payments it received under this contract.
- (2) Complete Work. The City may, but in no event is the City obligated to, complete the Work, which Work may be completed by the City's agents, employees or representatives or the City may retain independent persons or entities to complete the Work. Upon demand, Contractor agrees to pay to the City all of its costs and expenses in completing such Work.
- (3) Take Possession. The City may take possession of the Property and any equipment and materials on the Property and may sale the same, the proceeds of which shall be paid to the City for its damages.

(4) Remedies Not Exclusive. No remedy or election under this Contract shall be deemed an election by the City but shall be cumulative and in addition to all other remedies available to the City at law, in equity or by statute.

8. INDEMNIFICATION

8.1 Contractor Indemnification. The Contractor agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold the City, its elected officials, officers, employees, agents, and volunteers harmless from any and all claims, demands, losses, actions and liabilities (including costs and all attorney fees) to or by any and all persons or entities, including, without limitation, their respective agents, licensees, or representatives, arising from, resulting from, or connected with this Contract to the extent caused by the negligent acts, errors or omissions of the Contractor, its partners, shareholders, agents, employees, or by the Contractor's breach of this Contract. Contractor waives any immunity that may be granted to it under the Washington State Industrial Insurance Act, Title 51 RCW. Contractor's indemnification shall not be limited in any way by any limitation on the amount of damages, compensation or benefits payable to or by any third party under workers' compensation acts, disability benefit acts or any other benefits acts or programs.

8.2 City Indemnification. The City agrees to indemnify, defend, and hold the Contractor, its officers, directors, shareholders, partners, employees, and agents harmless from any and all claims, demands, losses, actions and liabilities (including costs and attorney fees) to or by any and all persons or entities, including without limitation, their respective agents, licenses, or representatives, arising from, resulting from or connected with this Contract to the extent solely caused by the negligent acts, errors, or omissions of the City, its employees or agents.

8.3 Survival. The provisions of this Section shall survive the expiration or termination of this Contract with respect to any event occurring prior to such expiration or termination.

9. INSURANCE

9.1 Minimum Limits. The Contractor agrees to carry as a minimum, the following insurance, in such forms and with such carriers who have a rating which is satisfactory to the City:

- (1) Workers' compensation and employer's liability insurance in amounts sufficient pursuant to the laws of the State of Washington;
- (2) Commercial general liability insurance with combined single limits of liability not less than \$2,000,000 for bodily injury, including personal injury or death, products liability and property damage.
- (3) Automobile liability insurance with combined single limits of liability not less than \$2,000,000 for bodily injury, including personal injury or death and property damage.

9.2 Endorsements. Each insurance policy shall contain, or be endorsed to contain, the following provisions:

(1) The City, its officers, officials, employees, volunteers and agents shall each be named as additional insured.

(2) Coverage may not be terminated or reduced in limits except after thirty (30) days prior written notice by certified mail, return receipt requested, to the City.

(3) Coverage shall be primary insurance as respects the City, its officials, employees and volunteers. Any insurance or self-insurance maintained by the City, its officials, employees or volunteers shall be in excess of Contractor's insurance.

(4) Coverage shall apply to each insured separately against whom claim is made or suit is brought.

(5) Coverage shall be written on an "occurrence" form as opposed to a "claims made" or "claims paid" form.

9.3 Verification. Contractor shall furnish the City with certificates of insurance evidencing the coverage required by the Section, in compliance with the Certificate(s) of Insurance Form attached hereto as Exhibit "F", which certificate must be executed by a person authorized by the insurer to bind coverage on its behalf. The City reserves the right to require complete certified copies of all required insurance policies, at any time.

9.4 Subcontractors. Contractors shall include all subcontractors as additional insured under its policies or shall furnish separate certificates for each subcontractor. All coverage for subcontractors shall be subject to all of the requirements stated herein.

9.5 Deductibles and Self-Insured Retentions. Any deductibles or self-insured retentions must be disclosed by Contractor and approved in writing by the City. At the option of the City, Contractor shall either reduce or eliminate such deductibles or self-insured retentions or procure a bond guaranteeing payment for any amounts not covered by the insurance by reason of such deductibles or self-insured retentions.

9.6 Asbestos Abatement or Hazardous Materials. If asbestos abatement or hazardous materials work is performed, Contractor shall review coverage with the City's Risk Manager and provide scope and limits of coverage that are appropriate for the scope of Work and are satisfactory to the City. Contractor shall not commence any Work until its coverage has been approved by the Risk Manager.

9.7 Termination. The Contractor's failure to provide the insurance coverage required by this Section shall be deemed to constitute non-acceptance of this Contract by the Contractor and the City may then award this Contract to the next lower bidder.

10. PERFORMANCE/PAYMENT BOND

Pursuant to RCW 39.08.010, Contractor shall post a Performance/Payment Bond in favor of the City, in the form attached to this Contract as Exhibit "G" and incorporated by this reference, in a dollar amount satisfactory to the City; to guarantee Contractor's performance of the Work to the City's satisfaction; to insure Contractor's performance of all of the provisions of this Contract; and to guarantee

Contractor's payment of all laborers, mechanics, subcontractors and material persons. Contractor's obligations under this Contract shall not be limited to the dollar amount of the bond.

11. SAFETY

Contractor shall take all necessary precautions for the safety of employees on the work site and shall comply with all applicable provisions of federal, state and municipal safety and health laws and codes, including without limitation, all OSHA/WISHA requirements, Safety and Health Standards for Construction Work (Chapter 296-155 WAC), General Safety and Health Standards (Chapter 296-24 WAC), and General Occupational Health Standards (Chapter 296-62 WAC). Contractor shall erect and properly maintain, at all times, all necessary guards, barricades, signals and other safeguards at all unsafe places at or near the Work for the protection of its employees and the public, safe passageways at all road crossings, crosswalks, street intersections, post danger signs warning against any known or unusual hazards and do all other things necessary to prevent accident or loss of any kind. Contractor shall protect from danger all water, sewer, gas, steam or other pipes or conduits, and all hydrants and all other property that is likely to become displaced or damaged by the execution of the Work. The Contractor shall, at its own expense, secure and maintain a safe storage place for its materials and equipment and is solely responsible for the same.

12. PREVAILING WAGES

12.1 Wages of Employees. This contract is subject to the minimum wage requirements of Chapter 39.12 RCW and Chapter 49.28 RCW (as amended or supplemented). On Federal-aid projects, Federal wage laws and rules also apply. The Hourly minimum rates for wages and fringe benefits are listed in Appendix B. When Federal wage and fringe benefit rates are listed, the rates match those identified by the U.S. Department of Labor's "Decision Number" shown in Appendix B.

The Contractor, any subcontractor, and all individuals or firms required by Chapter 39.12 RCW, Chapter 296-127 WAC, or the Federal Davis-Bacon and Related Acts (DBRA) to pay minimum prevailing wages, shall not pay any worker less than the minimum hourly wage rates and fringe benefits required by Chapter 39.12 RCW or the DBRA. Higher wages and benefits may be paid.

When the project is subject to both State and Federal hourly minimum rates for wages and fringe benefits and when the two rates differ for similar kinds of labor, the Contractor shall not pay less than the higher rate unless the state rates are specifically preempted by Federal law.

The Contractor shall ensure that any firm (Supplier, Manufacturer, or Fabricator) that falls under the provisions of Chapter 39.12 RCW because of the definition "Contractor" in Chapter 296-127-010 WAC, complies with all the requirements of Chapter 39.12 RCW.

12.2 Exemptions to Prevailing Wage. The prevailing wage requirements of Chapter 39.12 RCW, and as required in this Contract do not apply to:

- (1) Sole owners and their spouses;
- (2) Any partner who owns at least 30% of a partnership;

(3) The President, Vice President and Treasurer of a corporation if each one owns at least 30% of the corporation.

12.3 Reporting Requirements. On forms provided by the Industrial Statistician of State L&I, the Contractor shall submit to the Engineer the following for itself and for each firm covered under Chapter 39.12 RCW that provided work and materials of the contract:

(1) A copy of an approved "Statement of Intent to Pay Prevailing Wages" State L&I form number F700-029-000. The City will make no payment under this contract for the work performed until this statement has been approved by State L&I and a certified copy of the approved form has been submitted to the City.

(2) A copy of an approved "Affidavit of Prevailing Wages Paid," State L&I form number F700-007-000. The City will not release to the contractor any funds retained under Chapter 60.28.011 RCW until all of the "Affidavit of Prevailing Wages Paid" forms have been approved by State L&I and a certified copy of all the approved forms have been submitted to the City.

The Contractor shall be responsible for requesting these forms from the State L&I and for paying any approval fees required by State L&I.

Certified payrolls are required to be submitted by the Contractor to the City, for the Contractor and all subcontractors or lower tier subcontractors.

12.4 Disputes. In the event any dispute arises as to what are the prevailing rates of wages for work of a similar nature and such dispute cannot be resolved by the City and the Contractor, the matter shall be referred for arbitration to the Director of the Department of Labor and Industries of the State of Washington and the decision therein shall be final and conclusive and binding on all parties involved in the dispute.

13. FAILURE TO PAY SUBCONTRACTORS

In the event the Contractor shall fail to pay any subcontractors or laborers, fail to pay for any materials, or fail to pay any insurance premiums, the City may terminate this Contract and/or the City may withhold from the money which may be due the Contractor an amount necessary for the payment of such subcontractors, laborers, materials or premiums.

14. OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS

All originals and copies of work product, including plans, sketches, layouts, designs, design specifications, records, files, computer disks, magnetic media, all finished or unfinished documents or material which may be produced or modified by Contractor while performing the Work shall become the property of the City and shall be delivered to the City at its request.

15. CONFIDENTIALITY

Any records, reports, information, data or other documents or materials given to or prepared or assembled by the Contractor under this Contract will be kept as confidential and shall not be made available to any individual or organization by the Contractor without prior written approval of the City.

16. BOOKS AND RECORDS

The Contractor agrees to maintain books, records, and documents which sufficiently and properly reflect all direct and indirect costs related to the performance of this Contract and such accounting procedures and practices as may be deemed necessary by the City to assure proper accounting of all funds paid pursuant to this Contract. These records shall be subject at all reasonable times to inspection, review or audit by the City, its authorized representative, the State Auditor, or other governmental officials authorized by law to monitor this Contract.

17. CLEAN UP

At any time ordered by the City and immediately after completion of the Work, the Contractor shall, at its own expense, clean up and remove all refuse and unused materials of any kind resulting from the Work. In the event the Contractor fails to perform the necessary clean up, the City may, but in no event is it obligated to, perform the necessary clean up and the costs thereof shall be immediately paid by the Contractor to the City and/or the City may deduct its costs from any remaining payments due to the Contractor.

18. CONTRACTOR AND SUBCONTRACTOR RESPONSIBILITY:

18.1 Contractor Verification. The Contractor verifies that it has a certificate of registration with the State of Washington; has a current state unified business identifier number; is not disqualified from bidding on any public works contract under RCW 39.06.010 or 39.12.065 (3); has industrial insurance as required by Title 51 RCW, if applicable; has an employment security department number as required in Title 50 RCW, if applicable; has a state excise tax registration number as required in Title 82 RCW, if applicable; possesses a valid electrical contractor license as required by chapter 19.28 RCW, if applicable; and possesses an elevator contractor license as required by chapter 70.87 RCW, if applicable.

18.2 Subcontractor Contracts. The Contractor shall include the language of this section in each of its first tier subcontracts, and shall require each of its subcontractors to include the same language of this section in each of their subcontracts, adjusting only as necessary the terms used for the contracting parties. Upon request of the Owner, the Contractor shall promptly provide documentation to the Owner demonstrating that the subcontractor meets the subcontractor responsibility criteria below. The requirements of this section apply to all subcontractors regardless of tier.

18.3 Subcontractor Verification. At the time of subcontract execution, the Contractor shall verify that each of its first tier subcontractors meets the following bidder responsibility criteria: Have a current certificate of registration in compliance with chapter 18.27 RCW, which must have been in effect at the time of subcontract bid submittal; Have a current Washington Unified Business Identifier (UBI) number; Not be disqualified from bidding on any public works contract under RCW 39.06.010 or 39.12.065 (3); Have Industrial Insurance (workers' compensation) coverage for the subcontractor's employees working in Washington, as required in Title 51 RCW, if applicable; A Washington Employment Security Department number, as required in Title 50 RCW, if applicable; A Washington Department of Revenue state excise tax registration number, as required in Title 82 RCW, if applicable; An electrical contractor license, if required by Chapter 19.28 RCW, if applicable; An elevator contractor license, if required by Chapter 70.87 RCW.

19. GENERAL PROVISIONS

19.1 Entire Contract. The Contract Documents contain all of the agreements of the Parties with respect to any matter covered or mentioned in this Contract and no prior agreements or understandings pertaining to any such matters shall be effective for any purpose.

19.2 Modification. No provisions of this Contract, including this provision, may be amended or added to except by agreement in writing signed by the Parties or their respective successors in interest.

19.3 Full Force and Effect. Any provision of this Contract, which is declared invalid, void or illegal, shall in no way affect, impair, or invalidate any other provision hereof and such other provisions shall remain in full force and effect.

19.4 Assignment. The Contractor shall not transfer or assign, in whole or in part, any or all of its obligations and rights hereunder without the prior written consent of the City. In the event the City consents to any such assignment or transfer, such consent shall in no way release the Contractor from any of its obligations or liabilities under this Contract.

19.5 Successors In Interest. Subject to the preceding Subsection, this Contract shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the Parties' successors in interest, heirs and assigns.

19.6 Attorney Fees. In the event the City or the Contractor defaults on the performance of any terms in this Contract, and the Contractor or City places the enforcement of the Contract or any part thereof, or the collection of any monies due, or to become due hereunder, or recovery of possession of any belongings, in the hands of an attorney, or file suit upon the same, each Party shall pay all its own attorneys' fees, costs and expenses. The venue for any dispute related to this Contract shall be King County, Washington.

19.7 No Waiver. Failure of the City to declare any breach or default immediately upon occurrence thereof, or delay in taking any action in connection with, shall not waive such breach or default. Failure of the City to declare one breach or default does not act as a waiver of the City's right to declare another breach or default.

19.8 Governing Law. This Contract shall be made in and shall be governed by and interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Washington.

19.9 Authority. Each individual executing this Contract on behalf of the City and Contractor represents and warrants that such individuals are duly authorized to execute and deliver this Contract on behalf of the Contractor or City.

19.10 Notices. Any notices required to be given by the City to Contractor or by the Contractor to the City shall be delivered to the Parties at the addresses set forth below. Any notices may be delivered personally to the addressee of the notice or may be deposited in the United States mail, postage prepaid, to the address set forth herein. Any notice so posted in the United States mail shall be deemed received three (3) days after the date of mailing.

19.11 Captions. The respective captions of the Sections of this Contract are inserted for convenience of reference only and shall not be deemed to modify or otherwise affect in any respect any of the provisions of this Contract.

19.12 Performance. Time is of the essence of this Contract and each and all of its provisions in which performance is a factor. Adherence to completion dates is essential to the Contractor's performance of this Contract.

19.13 Compliance with Ethics Code. If a violation of the City's Ethics Resolution No. 91-54, as amended, occurs as a result of the formation and/or performance of this Contract, this Contract may be rendered null and void, at the City's option.

19.14 Conflicting Provisions. In the event of a conflict between the terms and provisions of any of the Contract Documents, the Mayor or his or her designee shall issue an interpretation of the controlling document, which interpretation shall be final and binding.

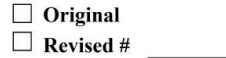

SECTION 5

SPECIAL PROVISIONS

SECTION 01010 – SUMMARY OF WORK

PART 1.0 GENERAL

1.01 GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

- A. Conform to Washington State Department of Transportation, Standard Specifications for Road, Bridge, and Municipal Construction, latest edition thereof. (Standard Specifications)
- B. All references to measurement and payment made in the Standard Specifications shall not apply to work performed under this Contract. Measurement and payment of work items shall be as specified in the Contract Documents.

1.02 WORK INCLUDED

Provide construction under a single contract for all general site work. The work consists of but is not limited to the following:

- Construction of temporary erosion controls, installation of shallow drainage network, drainage structures and infiltration galleries, placement of sand/soil mixture, fine grading and reseeding.

1.03 WORK NOT INCLUDED

Construction of gravel access road and construction entrance. All other items of work shown on the drawings and listed in these specifications are included in this contract.

1.04 TIME OF COMPLETION

Work on this contract may commence on or after the date of written Notice To Proceed and shall be completed and ready for use not later than forty seven (47) calendar days following. Contractors submitting bids shall take into consideration that they have the means to complete the work in accordance with the specified time schedule. Delays resulting from Contractor's inability to perform the work due to his own methods of operation and equipment will not be accepted.

1.05 SEQUENCE OF WORK

The work sequence shall be generally as follows:

1. Install temporary erosion control measures
2. Install perforated trench drains, drain rock, solid drainpipes and structures
3. Install infiltration galleries
4. Place sand/soil mix and fine grading
5. Seeding of field surfaces

The Contractor shall submit to the Owner any proposed modifications to the construction sequence plan listing the proposed projection of work. The plan

shall be submitted no later than ten (10) days after receiving the Notice to Proceed and prior to commencing work on the project.

1.06 OTHER CONTRACTS

Owner may undertake or award other contracts for additional work at or near the Project site. Contractor shall reasonably cooperate with the other contractors and with Owner's employees and shall carefully adapt scheduling and perform the Work in accordance with these Contract Documents to reasonably accommodate the other work.

1.07 HOURS OF OPERATION

Contractor shall limit operations to daylight hours only and from 7:00 am to 7:00 pm, Monday through Friday.

1.08 SAFETY AND OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH RULES AND REGULATIONS

Contractor in entering into a contract for this work agrees that he shall be solely responsible for conformance, by those in his employ and by his subcontractors and their employees and by others directly or indirectly connected with the work under his contract, with the requirements and regulations of the State of Washington Department of Labor and Industries, Division of Industrial Safety and Health Chapter 296-24 WAC "General Safety and Health Standards" Chapter 296-55 WAC "Safety Standards of Construction Work" for the use of all equipment and other safety rules and regulations required therein including protection of workmen in excavations.

The Contractor and each subcontractor at all times shall keep the premises free from accumulation of waste materials or rubbish caused by his operations. Clean up work area at completion of each week's work; no rubbish or waste material shall be left on the job site over the weekend. Remove all trash and debris from site and dispose of at the Contractor's expense. Allow no debris, broken or open cartons, or other refuse to collect in the project or around it; dispose of at Contractor's expense. 1.02 HEALTH AND SAFETY REGULATIONS AND CODES

1.03 FIELD OFFICE BUILDING

A field office building is not required but may be provided at the Contractor’s discretion. Location of the office shall be such that it does not hinder completion of this or other contracts, if any, as listed in Section 01010.

1.04 TELEPHONE

As a minimum, the Contractor’s project superintendent shall be equipped with a cellular phone.

1.05 WATER FOR CONSTRUCTION PURPOSES

Construction water and water for dust settling shall be provided by the Contractor. Cost of providing said water shall be incidental to the project.

1.06 TEMPORARY TOILETS

Provide adequate chemical toilet facilities for all employees connected with the work. Locate where directed when work is started; keep in sanitary conditions. Remove when directed and disinfect the premises.

1.07 TEMPORARY ELECTRICAL LIGHT AND POWER

Temporary electrical power for lighting or other services shall be the responsibility of the Contractor.

1.08 FENCES AND BARRICADES

1.01 WORK INCLUDED

 - 4. Gravel filled infiltration galleries.

1.02 DEFINITIONS

- A. PE: Polyethylene.
- B. HDPE: High-density polyethylene.
- C. PVC: Polyvinyl chloride.

1.03 SUBMITTALS

- A. Product Data: For gravel material, drainage pipe and structures.
 - 1. Perforated pipe.
 - 2. Solid pipe.
 - 3. Pipe fittings.
 - 4. Precast concrete structures.
 - 5. Gravel backfill for drains and galleries.

1.04 DELIVERY, STORAGE, AND HANDLING

- A. Do not store plastic structures, pipe, and fittings in direct sunlight.
- B. Protect pipe, pipe fittings, and seals from dirt and damage.
- C. Handle precast concrete manholes and other structures according to manufacturer's written rigging instructions.

PART 2.0 PRODUCTS

2.01 MANUFACTURERS

- A. In other Part 2 articles where subparagraph titles below introduce lists, the following requirements apply for product selection:
1. Available Manufacturers: Subject to compliance with requirements, manufacturers offering products that may be incorporated into the Work include, but are not limited to, the manufacturers specified.
 2. Manufacturers: Subject to compliance with requirements, provide products by the manufacturers specified.

2.02 PERFORATED DRAINPIPE AND FITTINGS

Pipe: perforated smooth wall coextruded PE pipe ASTM F 810-S with bell and spigot coupled joints, standard stiffness class.

1. Fittings/couplings: Manufacturer's standard, solvent weld band type.

2.03 SOLID DRAIN AND CLEANOUTS

PVC Pipe: ASTM D 3034, with bell and spigot coupled joints

PVC cleanout: threaded plug and threaded pipe hub, below-grade as detailed.

2.03 PRECAST CONCRETE CATCH BASINS

Normal-Traffic, Precast Concrete Catch Basins: ASTM C 478 (ASTM C 478M), precast, reinforced concrete, of depth indicated, with provision for rubber gasketed joints.

1. Base Section: 6-inch minimum thickness for floor slab and 4-inch minimum thickness for walls and base riser section, and having separate base slab or base section with integral floor.
2. Riser Sections: 4-inch minimum thickness, 48-inch diameter, and lengths to provide depth indicated.
3. Top Section: Eccentric-cone type, unless concentric-cone or flat-slab-top type is indicated. Top of cone of size that matches grade rings.
4. Gaskets: ASTM C 443 (ASTM C 443M), rubber.
5. Grade Rings: Include two or three reinforced concrete rings, of 6 to 9-inch total thickness, that match 24-inch diameter frame and grate.
6. Steps: Fiberglass, individual steps or ladder. Include width that allows worker to place both feet on one step and is designed to prevent lateral slip-page off step. Cast steps or anchor ladder into base, riser, and top section sidewalls at 12 to 16-inch intervals. Omit steps for catch basins less than 60 inches deep.
7. Steps: ASTM C 478 (ASTM C 478M), individual steps or ladder. Omit steps for catch basins less than 60 inches deep.
8. Pipe Connectors: ASTM C 923 (ASTM C 923M), resilient, of size required, for each pipe connecting to base section.

2.04 GRAVEL BACKFILL

- A. Backfill for perforated trench drains: small clean graded rock meeting WSDOT section 9-03.12(4) Gravel Backfill for Drains, or approved equal. "Medium pea" would be an acceptable alternative.
- B. Backfill for Infiltration Galleries: Washed, evenly graded mixture of crushed or non-crushed rock meeting WSDOT section 9-03.12(5) Gravel Backfill for Drywells, or an approved equal.

2.05 GEOTEXTILE FILTER FABRICS

- A. Woven or nonwoven geotextile filter fabric of PP or polyester fibers, or combination of both. Flow rates range from 110 to 330 gpm per sq. ft. (4480 to 13 440 L/min. per sq. m) when tested according to ASTM D 4491.

PART 3.0 EXECUTION

3.01 LAYOUT AND SOD REMOVAL

- A. Examine surfaces and areas for suitable conditions where subdrainage systems are to be installed. Surface conditions that are not conducive to installation of subdrainage improvements shall be brought to the attention of the engineer.
- B. Establish temporary benchmark and horizontal base lines for project control and layout, based on Plans. Final location of subsurface perforated trench drains shall be perpendicular to the football/soccer playfield and radially offset from the pitcher's mound for baseball field.
- C. Following layout of the trench drains, the Contractor shall remove sod using a commercial sod cutting device along the trench drain routes. Sod shall be removed from site and disposed of.

3.02 PROTECTION OF EXISTING IMPROVEMENTS

- A. The Contractor shall take measures to identify and protect existing irrigation infrastructure within the work area. Contractor shall coordinate with the Owner's field crew to operate the irrigation system and identify head locations and lateral locations where possible to identify potential conflicts. Remove irrigation heads and swing joints in locations where operations will impact or damage them. If lateral or mainline pipes are encountered during trenching for shallow drains or solid drain pipes, ensure their protection; broken PVC lateral or main lines shall be marked and repaired immediately.

3.03 INSTALLATION

- A. General Locations and Arrangements: Drawing plans and details indicate general location and arrangement of underground storm drainage piping. Location and arrangement of piping layout take design considerations into account. Install piping as indicated, to extent practical.
- B. Install piping beginning at low point, true to grades and alignment indicated with unbroken continuity of invert. Place bell ends of piping facing upstream. Install gaskets, seals, sleeves, and couplings according to manufacturer's written instructions for use of lubricants, cements, and other installation requirements. Maintain swab or drag in line, and pull past each joint as it is completed.
- C. Use manholes for changes in direction, unless fittings are indicated. Use fittings for branch connections, unless direct tap into existing sewer is indicated.
- D. Use proper size increasers, reducers, and couplings where different sizes or materials of pipes and fittings are connected. Reducing size of piping in direction of flow is prohibited.
- E. Install gravity flow piping and connect to building's storm drains, of sizes and in locations indicated. Terminate piping as indicated.
 - 1. Install piping pitched down in direction of flow, at minimum slope of 1 percent, unless otherwise indicated.
 - 2. Install piping with 24-inch minimum cover, unless otherwise indicated.
- F. Extend storm drainage piping and connect to trench drain fittings, of sizes and in locations indicated. Terminate piping as detailed.

3.04 PIPE JOINT CONSTRUCTION AND INSTALLATION

- A. PE Pipe and Fittings: As follows:
 - 1. Join pipe, tubing, and fittings with couplings for Soiltight joints according to manufacturer's written instructions.
 - 2. Install according to ASTM D 2321 and manufacturer's written instructions.
- B. PVC Sewer Pipe and Fittings: As follows:
 - 1. Join pipe and gasketed fittings with gaskets according to ASTM D 2321.

3.05 SUBDRAINAGE CLEANOUT INSTALLATION

Install cleanouts from subdrainage piping to below grade as detailed. Locate cleanouts at beginning of piping run and at changes in direction. Install fittings so cleanouts open in direction of flow in piping.

3.06 CLEANING

Clear interior of installed piping and structures of dirt and other superfluous material as work progresses. Maintain swab or drag in piping and pull past each joint as it is completed. Place plugs in ends of uncompleted pipe at end of each day or when work stops.

3.0 IRRIGATION SYSTEM

Replace all irrigation heads and swing joints removed prior to trenching and drainage work. Following completion of drainage improvements, the Contractor shall coordinate with the Owner's crew to test the irrigation system for complete and satisfactory operation as prior to start of construction. Make additional repairs as needed to irrigation system for satisfactory operation.

SECTION 02900- ATHLETIC SURFACE

PART 1.0 GENERAL

1.01 GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

- A. Conform to the Contract Documents and Standard Specifications.

1.02 WORK INCLUDED

Work in this section consists of but is not limited to the following:

- A. Backfill trench drains with sand/soil mix.
- B. Top dress existing sod surface with a sand/soil mixture over areas where surfaces are disturbed due to new drainage improvements and fine grade for a final athletic playing surface that blends evenly into other adjacent playing surfaces.
- C. Seed finished grades with an athletic field turfgrass mix. Seeding shall be performed by Contractor/Sub-Contractor with a minimum of 10 years of experience with turfgrass sports field installation.
- D. The Contractor will coordinate all activities necessary for the provision of all labor, materials, tools, equipment and services necessary to complete all operations in accordance with these specifications.

1.03 PRESERVATION OF PROPERTY

- A. The planting operations shall be conducted in such manners that no damage shall result to new or existing site improvements and existing athletic surfaces outside the work area. The Contractor shall be responsible for any damage resulting from his operation and shall repair or replace such damage at his own expense by qualified trades and/or installers acceptable to the Owner.

1.04 JOB CONDITIONS

- A. Planting operations including final seed bed preparation shall proceed only during periods which are normal for work as determined by season, weather conditions, and accepted practice.
- B. When conditions detrimental to plant growth are encountered, such as rubble, rubble fill, adverse drainage conditions, or obstructions, notify Landscape Architect/Owner before planting.

PART 2.0 PRODUCTS

2.01 SAND/SOIL MATERIALS

A. Topdress material shall be:

1. Sand for final topdressing field surface shall conform to WSDOT section 9-03.13(1) Sand Backfill for Drains, or a product having similar sieve analysis.
2. Compost soil amendment for soil preparation and use half in soil mix shall be a nitrified wood residual product, composted at 130 to 160 for four (4) and six (6) months and screened to 1/2" minus in size. Soil amendment shall be equal to the following compost brands as available from:

- B. Topdress Soil mix shall be a homogeneous blend of the previous materials, in a ratio, by weight, as follows: 40% sand and 60% compost.

2.02 SAND SOIL BACKFILL FOR TRENCH

- A. Backfill material for the trench drains, above the gravel materials, shall be the in-situ sand/soil materials excavated from the upper 12 inches of the trench. This material shall be generally free of sod.

2.03 SEED

- A. Grass seed of the type specified shall conform to the standards for "Certified" grade seed or better as outlined by the State of Washington Department of Agriculture "Rules for Seed Certification," latest edition. Seed shall be furnished in standard containers on which shall be shown the following information:

1. Common name of seed

2. Lot number
 3. Net weight
 4. Percentage of purity
 5. Percentage of germination (in case of legumes, percentage of germination to include hard seed).
 6. Percentage of weed seed content and inert material clearly marked for each kind of seed in accordance with applicable State and Federal Laws.
- B. Upon request, the Contractor shall furnish to the Landscape Architect duplicate copies of a statement signed by the vendor certifying that each lot of seed has been tested by a recognized seed testing laboratory within six months before the delivery on the project. Seed which has become wet, moldy, or otherwise damaged in transit, or storage will not be accepted.

PART 3.0 EXECUTION

3.01 TRENCH BACKFILL

- A. Topsoil (sand/soil) material excavated from the upper twelve inches of the trench drains shall be used to backfill the trench following placement of perforated drain pipe and gravels. Excavated materials may be stockpiled adjacent to the trench or in a common area on site until replacement.
- B. Topsoil shall be placed in no greater than eight inch lifts and proof-rolled (tracked or bucket-tamped). Vibratory compaction is not desired on this material.

3.02 AREA TO BE TOPDRESSED AND SEEDED

- A. The Contractor shall place topdressing materials over the trench drains and all other areas of the work area being disturbed during the project. Fill wheel tracks and other deformities in the athletic surfaces.

3.03 SURFACE PREPARATION

- A. All drainage improvements shall be completed and approved prior to topdressing, final grading and seeding. Seeded areas shall be prepared so that they remain weed and debris free until the time of final acceptance. The planting areas shall include all planting beds and those areas shown on the plans or directly by the Landscape Architect/Owner.

3.04 FINISH GRADING

- A. TOPDRESSING: Spread or broadcast with drop spreader topdressing sand material called for above. Fill tracks or other indentations produced during drainage construction. Placement shall be done in such a manner as to anticipate the finished grade.
- B. SURFACES: All planting surfaces shall be left with a firm, uniform surface, free of undulations or other irregularities. Remove all rocks, clods, and debris from all planting surfaces. Ensure a smooth transition between existing turf outside work area and top dressed surfaces.
- C. FINAL GRADING AND DRAINAGE: Deviations in the final surface shall not vary more than one inch over any 10 foot distance. The Contractor shall bear final responsibility for proper surface drainage of the site and the features thereon. Ensure no areas of the finish grade will impound surface water.

3.05 HYDROSEEDING

- A. The Contractor shall coordinate with the Owner's crew to determine the satisfactory restoration of the existing irrigation system, including replacement of any heads or equipment previously removed by the contractor prior to trenching. Final seeding shall not begin until the irrigation system is complete and operational.
- B. Surface preparation and fine grading shall be performed as previously specified for the field areas.
- C. The Contractor shall notify the Landscape Architect not less than 24 hours in advance of seedbed preparation, and shall not begin the work until areas prepared or designated for seeding have been approved. Seed and fertilizer shall be placed at the rate and mixture specified.
- D. Seeding shall be performed in a hydraulic application using water as the carrying agent and maintains continuous agitation to suspend and mix a homogenous slurry of seed, mulch and binding agents.
- E. The seed mixtures shall be as specified on the plans.
- F. Prior to acceptance, the seeded areas shall be mowed a minimum of one cutting after the grass has attained a height of at least 2 inches, See Section 3.06 herein. The cutting height shall not be less than 1 inch or exceed 2 inches in height with all cuttings removed. Acceptance of seeding as herein specified shall be based on a uniform stand of grass and uniform grade at the time of final inspection.

3.06 RESPONSIBILITY FOLLOWING SEEDING

- A. The Contractor shall insure adequate and proper care of all plant material and work done on this project until the contract is completed and accepted. Adequate and proper care shall include keeping all plant material in a healthy, growing condition.
- B. The Contractor shall have sole responsibility for keeping the planted areas free from insect infestation, weeds and grass, litter, and other debris, along with retaining the finished grades in a neat uniform condition.
- C. Maintenance activities for this 60-day period shall include:
 - 1. Protect all areas against damage, including erosion and trespass, and provide all necessary safeguards. Maintain and keep in good repair all temporary barriers erected to prevent trespass.
 - 2. Maintain and control all site access roads. Keep the site free from debris resulting from landscape work and maintenance.
 - 3. Check all barriers and temporary fencing daily during the work week and repair or replace immediately as needed.
 - 4. Coordinate with Owner's crew to maintain adequate moisture in soil to ensure vigorous growth. This includes non-irrigated areas.
- D. The Owner's crew will provide mowing following successful turf growth to a height of 2 inches. Contractor is not responsible for mowing any seeded areas. The Owner indemnifies the Contractor of any responsibility for surface grades due to mowing equipment during establishment.

3.07 CLEANUP

Upon completion of the work under this section, Contractor shall remove from the premises all surplus materials, tools, equipment, rubbish, and debris; wash all dirt and fertilizer from pavements, curbs, walls and other structures resulting from his/her work and leave the work in clean, neat and workmanlike conditions satisfactory to the Landscape Architect.

3.08 PUNCH LIST FIELD VISIT

- A. A punch list field visit shall be requested by the Contractor when installation as set forth on drawings and specifications is substantially

complete. Landscape Architect shall be given forty-eight (48) hours notifications prior to inspection.

- B. Completion of general inspection, punch list items and acceptance of the contract work by the Owner's representative and the Landscape Architect shall mark the start of the 60-day maintenance period under paragraph 3.06 above.

3.09 FINAL PROJECT CLOSE-OUT

The final project close-out of work for acceptance of the work will be made at the conclusion of the 60-day maintenance period, upon successful completion of all punch list items and upon 4 days notice to the Landscape Architect requesting this site visit. At this visit, all plants must be in a healthy growing condition, weeds not in evidence, pruning complete, staking and tying secure, sprinkler risers vertical, and sprinklers performing as per manufacturer's description. Acceptance shall follow upon meeting these requirements. Acceptance of the final site visit shall mark the start of all workmanship and plant guarantees.

3.10 GUARANTEE

- A. The Contractor shall furnish to the Owner any guarantee or warranty furnished as a normal trade practice in connection with his purchase of any equipment, materials, or items which are to be incorporated into the project.
- B. All plant materials shall be guaranteed to be in a living, healthy, and disease-free condition from the date of acceptance to the completion of one full year, or one full growing season, whichever is longer. One full growing season shall be considered for the purpose of this contract as the period from April 1st to October 1st of any given year. Any plant material replaced during the guarantee period will again be thus guaranteed. Contractor shall not be held responsible for theft, vandalism or adverse weather conditions beyond the 60-day maintenance period.

Overtime Codes

Overtime calculations are based on the hourly rate actually paid to the worker. On public works projects, the hourly rate must be not less than the prevailing rate of wage minus the hourly rate of the cost of fringe benefits actually provided for the worker.

1. ALL HOURS WORKED IN EXCESS OF EIGHT (8) HOURS PER DAY OR FORTY (40) HOURS PER WEEK SHALL BE PAID AT ONE AND ONE-HALF TIMES THE HOURLY RATE OF WAGE.
 - B. All hours worked on Saturdays shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
 - C. The first two (2) hours after eight (8) regular hours Monday through Friday and the first ten (10) hours on Saturday shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All other overtime hours and all hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
 - D. The first two (2) hours before or after a five-eight (8) hour workweek day or a four-ten (10) hour workweek day and the first eight (8) hours worked the next day after either workweek shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All additional hours worked and all worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.

 - I. All hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall also be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
 - J. The first two (2) hours after eight (8) regular hours Monday through Friday and the first ten (10) hours on Saturday shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked over ten (10) hours Monday through Saturday, Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
 - K. All hours worked on Saturdays and Sundays shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
 - M. All hours worked on Saturdays (except makeup days if work is lost due to inclement weather conditions) shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
 - N. All hours worked on Saturdays (except makeup days) shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.

1. O. The first ten (10) hours worked on Saturday shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on Sundays, holidays and after twelve (12) hours, Monday through Friday and after ten (10) hours on Saturday shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
- P. All hours worked on Saturdays (except makeup days if circumstances warrant) and Sundays shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
- Q. The first two (2) hours after eight (8) regular hours Monday through Friday and up to ten (10) hours worked on Saturdays shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. When holiday falls on Saturday or Sunday, the day before Saturday, Friday, and the day after Sunday, Monday, shall be considered the holiday and all work performed shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.

All hours worked outside the hours of 5:00 am and 5:00 pm (or such other hours as may be agreed upon by any employer and the employee) and all hours worked in excess of eight (8) hours per day (10 hours per day for a 4 x 10 workweek) and on Saturdays and holidays (except labor day) shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All work performed after 6:00 pm Saturday to 5:00 am Monday and Holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage. After an employee has worked eight (8) hours at an applicable overtime rate, all additional hours shall be at the applicable overtime rate until such time as the employee has had a break of eight (8) hours or more.

3. E. All hours worked Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage. Each week, once 40 hours of straight time work is achieved, then any hours worked over 10 hours per day Monday through Saturday shall be paid at double the hourly wage rate.
- F. All hours worked on Saturday shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on Sunday shall be paid at two times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on paid holidays shall be paid at two and one-half times the hourly rate of wage including holiday pay.
- H. All work performed on Sundays between March 16th and October 14th and all Holidays shall be compensated for at two (2) times the regular rate of pay. Work performed on Sundays between October 15th and March 15th shall be compensated at one and one half (1-1/2) times the regular rate of pay.

All work performed after 6:00 pm Saturday to 5:00 am Monday and Holidays, and all hours worked in excess of twelve (12) hours in a single shift shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.

After an employee has worked eight (8) hours at an applicable overtime rate, all additional hours shall be at the applicable overtime rate until such time as the employee has had a break of eight (8) hours or more. When an employee returns to work without at least eight (8) hours time off since their previous shift, all such time shall be a continuation of shift and paid at the applicable overtime rate until he/she shall have the eight (8) hours rest period.

4. ALL HOURS WORKED IN EXCESS OF EIGHT (8) HOURS PER DAY OR FORTY (40) HOURS PER WEEK SHALL BE PAID AT ONE AND ONE-HALF TIMES THE HOURLY RATE OF WAGE.
- A. All hours worked in excess of eight (8) hours per day or forty (40) hours per week shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on Saturdays, Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
- B. All hours worked over twelve (12) hours per day and all hours worked on holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
- C. On Monday through Friday, the first four (4) hours of overtime after eight (8) hours of straight time work shall be paid at one and one half (1-1/2) times the straight time rate of pay, unless a four (4) day ten (10) hour workweek has been established. On a four (4) day ten (10) hour workweek scheduled Monday through Thursday, or Tuesday through Friday, the first two (2) hours of overtime after ten (10) hours of straight time work shall be paid at one and one half (1-1/2) times the straight time rate of pay. 4. D. All hours worked in excess of eight (8) hours per day or forty (40) hours per week shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on Saturday, Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of pay. Rates include all members of the assigned crew.

EXCEPTION:

On all multipole structures and steel transmission lines, switching stations, regulating, capacitor stations, generating plants, industrial plants, associated installations and substations, except those substations whose primary function is to feed a distribution system, will be paid overtime under the following rates:

The first two (2) hours after eight (8) regular hours Monday through Friday of overtime on a regular workday, shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours in excess of ten (10) hours will be at two (2) times the hourly rate of wage. The first eight (8) hours worked on Saturday will be paid at one and one-half (1-1/2) times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked in excess of eight (8) hours on Saturday, and all hours worked on Sundays and holidays will be at the double the hourly rate of wage.

- E. The first two (2) hours after eight (8) regular hours Monday through Friday and the first eight (8) hours on Saturday shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All other hours worked Monday through Saturday, and all hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.

On a four-day, ten-hour weekly schedule, either Monday thru Thursday or Tuesday thru Friday schedule, all hours worked after ten shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage. The Monday or Friday not utilized in the normal four-day, ten hour work week, and Saturday shall be paid at one and one half (1½) times the regular shift rate for the first eight (8) hours. All other hours worked Monday through Saturday, and all hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.

- F. All hours worked between the hours of 6:00 pm and 6:00 am, Monday through Saturday, shall be paid at a premium rate of 20% over the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on Sundays shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
- G. All hours worked on Saturdays shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked Monday through Saturday over twelve (12) hours and all hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
- H. The first two (2) hours after eight (8) regular hours Monday through Friday and the first eight (8) hours on Saturday shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All other overtime hours worked, except Labor Day, and all hours on Sunday shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on Labor Day shall be paid at three times the hourly rate of wage.
- I. The First eight (8) hours worked on Saturdays shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked in excess of eight (8) per day on Saturdays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
- J. The first eight (8) hours worked on a Saturday shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked in excess of eight (8) hours on a Saturday shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked over twelve (12) in a day, and all hours worked on Sundays and Holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
- K. All hours worked on a Saturday shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage, so long as Saturday is the sixth consecutive day worked. All hours worked over twelve (12) in a day Monday through Saturday, and all hours worked on Sundays and Holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.

4. L. The first twelve (12) hours worked on a Saturday shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on a Saturday in excess of twelve (12) hours shall be paid at double the hourly rate of pay. All hours worked over twelve (12) in a day Monday through Friday, and all hours worked on Sundays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on a holiday shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage, except that all hours worked on Labor Day shall be paid at double the hourly rate of pay.
- M. All hours worked on Sunday and Holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate. Any employee reporting to work less than nine (9) hours from their previous quitting time shall be paid for such time at time and one-half times the hourly rate.

After an employee has worked in excess of eight (8) continuous hours in any one or more calendar days, all additional hours shall be at the applicable overtime rate until such time as the employee has had a break of six (6) hours or more. All hours worked on Holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
- P. All hours worked on Holidays shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage.
- Q. The first four (4) hours after eight (8) regular hours Monday through Friday and the first eight (8) hours on Saturday shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked over twelve (12) hours Monday through Saturday shall be paid at double the hourly rate. All hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
- R. All hours worked on Saturdays shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage, so long as Saturday is the sixth consecutive day worked. All hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
- S. All hours worked on Saturdays and Holidays shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on Sundays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
- T. The first two (2) hours of overtime for hours worked Monday-Friday shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked in excess of ten (10) hours per day shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage. For work on Saturday which is scheduled prior to the end of shift on Friday, the first six (6) hours work shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage, and all hours over (6) shall be paid double the hourly rate of wage. For work on Saturday which was assigned following the close of shift on Friday, all work shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.
- U. The first four (4) hours after eight (8) regular hours Monday through Friday and the first twelve (12) hours on Saturday shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. (Except on makeup days if work is lost due to inclement weather, then the first eight (8) hours on Saturday may be paid the regular rate.) All hours worked over twelve (12) hours Monday through Saturday, and all hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.

Overtime Codes Continued

4. V. Work performed in excess of ten (10) hours of straight time per day when four ten (10) hour shifts are established or outside the normal shift (5 am to 6pm), and all work on Saturdays, except for make-up days shall be paid at time and one-half (1 ½) the straight time rate.

In the event the job is down due to weather conditions, then Saturday may, be worked as a voluntary make-up day at the straight time rate. However, Saturday shall not be utilized as a make-up day when a holiday falls on Friday. All work performed on Sundays and holidays and work in excess of twelve (12) hours per day shall be paid at double (2x) the straight time rate of pay.

After an employee has worked eight (8) hours at an applicable overtime rate, all additional hours shall be at the applicable overtime rate until such time as the employee has had a break of eight (8) hours.

When an employee returns to work without a break of eight (8) hours since their previous shift, all such time shall be a continuation of shift and paid at the applicable overtime rate until such time as the employee has had a break of eight (8) hours.

- W. All hours worked on Saturdays (except makeup days if work is lost due to inclement weather conditions) shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage.

When an employee returns to work without at least eight (8) hours time off since their previous shift, all such time shall be a continuation of shift and paid at the applicable overtime rate until such time as the employee has had a break of eight (8) hours.

- X. All hours worked on Saturdays shall be paid at one and one-half times the hourly rate of wage. All hours worked on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage. Work performed outside the normal shift of 6 am to 6pm shall be paid at one and one-half the straight time rate, (except for special shifts or three shift operations). All work performed on Sundays and holidays shall be paid at double the hourly rate of wage. Shifts may be established when considered necessary by the Employer.

The Employer may establish shifts consisting of eight (8) or ten (10) hours of work (subject to WAC 296-127-022), that shall constitute a normal forty (40) hour work week. The Employer can change from a 5-eight to a 4-ten hour schedule or back to the other. All hours of work on these shifts shall be paid for at the straight time hourly rate. Work performed in excess of eight hours (or ten hours per day (subject to WAC 296-127-022) shall be paid at one and one-half the straight time rate.

When due to conditions beyond the control of the Employer, or when contract specifications require that work can only be performed outside the regular day shift, then by mutual agreement a special shift may be worked at the straight time rate, eight (8) hours work for eight (8) hours pay. The starting time shall be arranged to fit such conditions of work.

When an employee returns to work without at a break of eight (8) hours since their previous shift, all such time shall be a continuation of shift and paid at the applicable overtime rate until such time as the employee has had a break of eight (8) hours.

4. Y. Washington State Department of Labor and Industries
Policy Statement
(Regarding the Production of "Standard" or "Non-standard" Items)

Below is the department's (State L&I's) list of criteria to be used in determining whether a prefabricated item is "standard" or "non-standard". For items not appearing on WSDOT's predetermined list, these criteria shall be used by the Contractor (and the Contractor's subcontractors, agents to subcontractors, suppliers, manufacturers, and fabricators) to determine coverage under RCW 39.12. The production, in the State of Washington, of non-standard items is covered by RCW 39.12, and the production of standard items is not. The production of any item outside the State of Washington is not covered by RCW 39.12.

1. Is the item fabricated for a public works project? If not, it is not subject to RCW 39.12. If it is, go to question 2.
2. Is the item fabricated on the public works jobsite? If it is, the work is covered under RCW 39.12. If not, go to question 3.
3. Is the item fabricated in an assembly/fabrication plant set up for, and dedicated primarily to, the public works project? If it is, the work is covered by RCW 39.12. If not, go to question 4.
4. Does the item require any assembly, cutting, modification or other fabrication by the supplier? If not, the work is not covered by RCW 39.12. If yes, go to question 5.
5. Is the prefabricated item intended for the public works project typically an inventory item which could reasonably be sold on the general market? If not, the work is covered by RCW 39.12. If yes, go to question 6.
6. Does the specific prefabricated item, generally defined as standard, have any unusual characteristics such as shape, type of material, strength requirements, finish, etc? If yes, the work is covered under RCW 39.12.

(The definition of "locality" in RCW [39.12.010](#)(2) contains the phrase "wherein the physical work is being performed." The department interprets this phrase to mean the actual work site.

Washington State Department of Labor and Industries
Policy Statements
(Regarding Production and Delivery of Gravel, Concrete, Asphalt, etc.)

WAC 296-127-018 Agency filings affecting this section

Coverage and exemptions of workers involved in the production and delivery of gravel, concrete, asphalt, or similar materials.

(1) The materials covered under this section include but are not limited to: Sand, gravel, crushed rock, concrete, asphalt, or other similar materials.

(2) All workers, regardless of by whom employed, are subject to the provisions of chapter 39.12 RCW when they perform any or all of the following functions:

(a) They deliver or discharge any of the above-listed materials to a public works project site:

(i) At one or more point(s) directly upon the location where the material will be incorporated into the project; or

(ii) At multiple points at the project; or

(iii) Adjacent to the location and coordinated with the incorporation of those materials.

(b) They wait at or near a public works project site to perform any tasks subject to this section of the rule.

(c) They remove any materials from a public works construction site pursuant to contract requirements or specifications (e.g., excavated materials, materials from demolished structures, clean-up materials, etc.).

(d) They work in a materials production facility (e.g., batch plant, borrow pit, rock quarry, etc.,) which is established for a public works project for the specific, but not necessarily exclusive, purpose of supplying materials for the project.

(e) They deliver concrete to a public works site regardless of the method of incorporation.

(f) They assist or participate in the incorporation of any materials into the public works project.

(3) All travel time that relates to the work covered under subsection (2) of this section requires the payment of prevailing wages. Travel time includes time spent waiting to load, loading, transporting, waiting to unload, and delivering materials. Travel time would include all time spent in travel in support of a public works project whether the vehicle is empty or full. For example, travel time spent returning to a supply source to obtain another load of material for use on a public works site or returning to the public works site to obtain another load of excavated material is time spent in travel that is subject to prevailing wage. Travel to a supply source, including travel from a public works site, to obtain materials for use on a private project would not be travel subject to the prevailing wage.

(4) Workers are not subject to the provisions of chapter 39.12 RCW when they deliver materials to a stockpile.

(a) A "stockpile" is defined as materials delivered to a pile located away from the site of incorporation such that the stockpiled materials must be physically moved from the stockpile and transported to another location on the project site in order to be incorporated into the project.

(b) A stockpile does not include any of the functions described in subsection (2)(a) through (f) of this section; nor does a stockpile include materials delivered or distributed to multiple locations upon the project site; nor does a stockpile include materials dumped at the place of incorporation, or adjacent to the location and coordinated with the incorporation.

(5) The applicable prevailing wage rate shall be determined by the locality in which the work is performed. Workers subject to subsection (2)(d) of this section, who produce such materials at an off-site facility shall be paid the applicable prevailing wage rates for the county in which the off-site facility is located. Workers subject to subsection (2) of this section, who deliver such materials to a public works project site shall be paid the applicable prevailing wage rates for the county in which the public works project is located.

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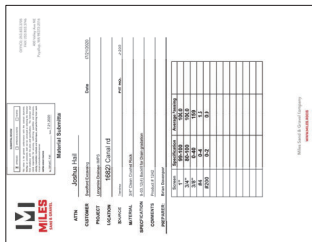
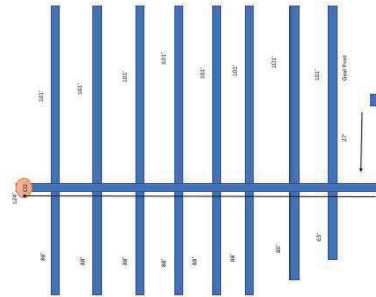

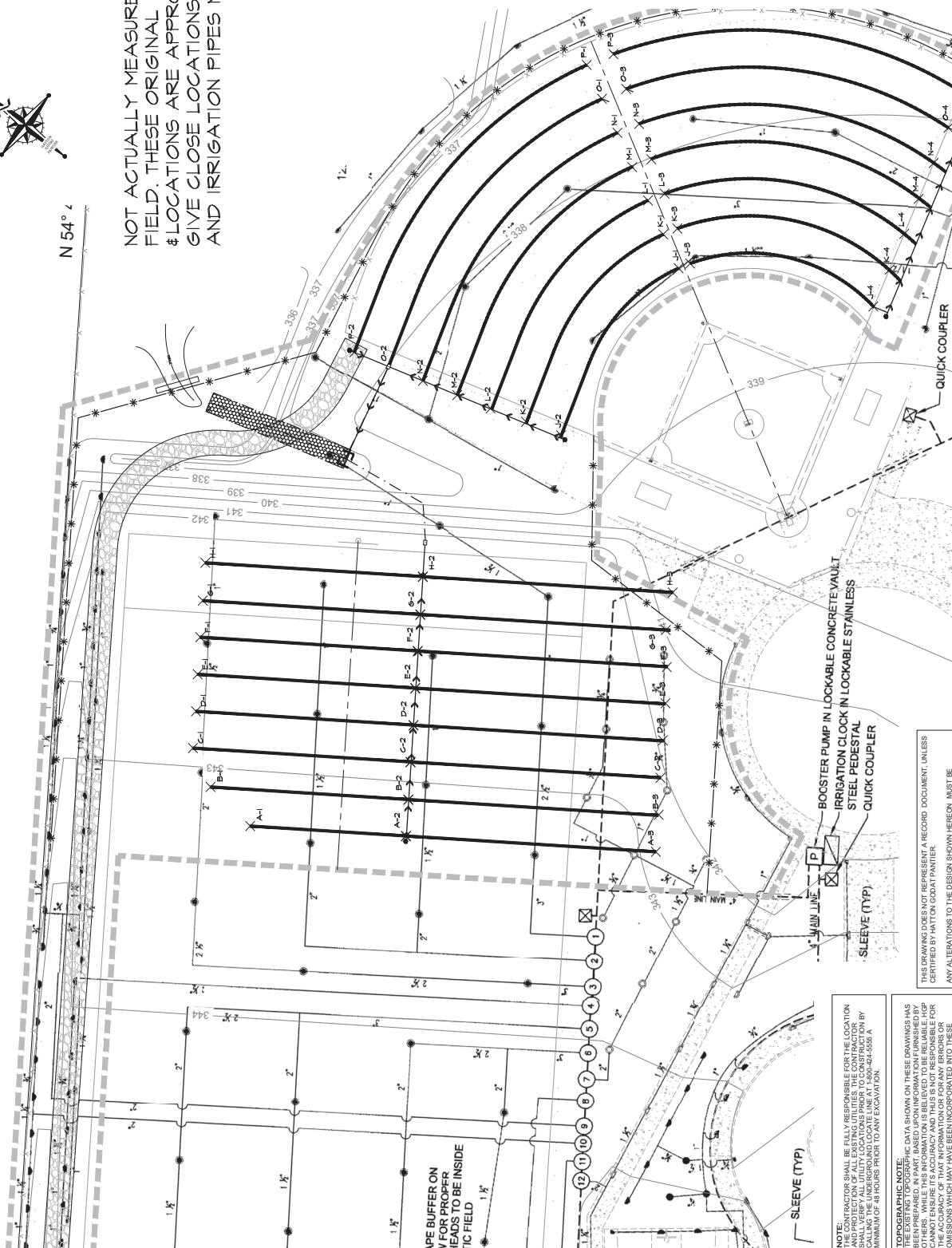
