2023 Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP)

The Yuba County Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP) is a long term, systematic plan to address health issues identified in the 2023 Yuba County Community Health Assessment (CHA). The purpose of the CHIP is to provide a framework to address the top three health priority areas over the next 3-5 years. The CHIP is the collective efforts of local stakeholders and community leaders committed to enhancing the overall health of Yuba County.

Health Priority Areas

Healthcare Access

Access to healthcare not only means having available medical facilities but also ensuring these facilities can meet the diverse needs of the community. Addressing healthcare access directly impacts the well-being of our residents.

Mental Health Access

Mental health has an impact on overall physical health, yet it often remains under-addressed. Through innovative initiatives, this priority aims to expand access to services, reduce stigma, and integrate mental health services into broader community health initiatives.

Safe Neighborhoods & Built Environments

Safe neighborhoods and built environments promote physical activity, reduce the risk of injury, and foster social connections. This priority recognizes that in addition to individual choices, health is influenced by the spaces in which we live, work, and play.

Health Priority #1: Health Care Access

Goal 1:

Expand availability of mobile healthcare services in Yuba County

Goal 2:

Promote a culture where access to healthcare is viewed as a means of wellness and disease prevention

Goal 3:

Promote increase in data information sharing among health and social services providers within Yuba County

Health Priority #2: Mental Health Access

Goal 1:

Expand access to mental health services in Yuba County for high-priority populations (e.g., youth, maternal mental health) through promotion of available resources and by de-stigmatizing access to mental health services.

Goal 2:

Provide mobile mental health services beyond conventional facility-based treatment.

Goal 3:

Expand workforce capacity to deliver mental health services across the continuum of mental health needs

Goal 1:

Increase the use of the currently available recreational options in Yuba County

Goal 2:

Enhance a culture in Yuba County to gather as a community and move freely as a means of wellness and health promotion
