**RESOLUTION NO. 2021-103**

**WHEREAS**, after proclaiming a state of emergency on March 4, 2020, Governor Newsom signed Executive Order N-25-20 on March 12, 2020 ordering all residents to obey any orders and guidance issued by state and local public health officials, including but not limited to the imposition of social distancing measures, to control the spread of COVID-19; and

**WHEREAS**, California has a need for non-congregate shelter options for people experiencing homelessness and in need of such space; and

**WHEREAS**, the Yuba County Health and Human Services Department (HHSD) received five (5) travel trailers, from the California Department of General Services (DGS) for the California Department of Social Services' (CDSS's) Project Roomkey (PRK) initiative, as a resource to operationalize emergency non-congregate shelter as part of the County's emergency response to COVID-19; and

**WHEREAS**, in response to the requirement to be able to provide non-congregate shelter to 15% of the homeless population in order to receive the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security Act (CARES) funding, the County purchased an additional twenty (20) travel trailers – seventeen (17) were purchased with CARES funding and three (3) were purchased with Public Health Emergency Preparedness (PHEP) COVID-19 funding; and

**WHEREAS**, fortunately, positive cases of COVID-19 within our unsheltered population is now minimal and does not necessitate use of the twenty-five (25) travel trailers; and

**WHEREAS**, it is in the best interest of Yuba County to disseminate its travel trailer stock to community partners. While the five (5) CDSS-funded travel trailers must specifically be used to support persons experiencing homelessness, the twenty (20) trailers purchased by HHSD may be more broadly used to support our community; and

**WHEREAS**, HHSD proposes to disseminate one (1) travel trailer to the Marysville Police Department to be used for overnight shelter for the caretaker of the Marysville Cemetery.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED**, that the Yuba County Board of Supervisors hereby:

1. authorizes the reallocation of one (1) travel trailer to the Marysville Police Department;
2. authorizes the HHSD Director to execute all documents as required for the reallocation of the one (1) travel trailer;
3. finds that reallocating one (1) travel trailer to the Marysville Police Department serves a public purpose by providing overnight shelter for the caretaker of the Marysville Cemetery; and

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4. authorizes the HHSD Director to: enter into a memorandum of understanding with the Marysville Police Department to establish the intended use of the one (1) reallocated travel trailer; and execute, subject to review and approval of County Counsel, all required documents including the memorandum of understanding and subsequent amendments with the Marysville Police Department.


