RESOLUTION NO. 2022-207,

WHEREAS, Yuba County is a subdivision of the State of California, and may make laws to preserve and commemorate the heritage of the United States of America that are not in conflict with general law; and

WHEREAS, the American Revolution secured the independence of the United States and made possible the vibrant system of self-government of the United States; and

WHEREAS, the supporters of the American Revolution, through their vision and determination, enhanced the lives of countless individuals and made possible the system of equal justice, limited government, and rule of law that exists in the United States; and

WHEREAS, the people who fought in the American Revolution made great sacrifices for their fledgling country; and

WHEREAS, the 55 delegates who attended the Constitutional Convention in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania in 1787 and the 39 delegates who signed the United States Constitution at the Constitutional Convention irrevocably changed the course of history and established the imperative precedent of compromise; and

WHEREAS, the Constitution of the United States, a revered and living document, protects important rights of every citizen of the United States, secures “the Blessings of Liberty to ourselves and our Posterity,” and sets the standard of democracy for the world; and

WHEREAS, the United States Constitution, and its amendments, outline the freedoms and the principles of representative government that are as strong today as they were on that momentous occasion in 1787; and

WHEREAS, the culture of freedom and self-government that defines the United States can be sustained as long as each generation develops a deep understanding and commitment to

the principles of our founding documents and, accordingly, it is vital that every American be educated in the knowledge of our Constitution; and

WHEREAS, the Congress of the United States of America recognized September 17th as Constitution Day and September 17-23 as Constitution Week to celebrate and remember the Constitution of the United States; and

WHEREAS, it is the intention of the Board of Supervisors of the County of Yuba to recognize a time to honor, celebrate and remember the Constitution of the United States.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of Supervisors, County of Yuba, State of California, hereby designates September 17th as Constitution Day and encourages the government of the County of Yuba, schools, nonprofit organizations, business and other people and organizations in the County of Yuba to observe Constitution Day with appropriate events and activities to promote awareness and knowledge of the Constitution of the United States.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the Yuba County Board of Supervisors hereby designates the week following September 17th as Constitution Week and encourages the government of the County of Yuba, schools, nonprofit organizations, business and other people and organizations in the County of Yuba to observe Constitution Week with appropriate events and activities to promote awareness and knowledge of the Constitution of the United States.
