<u>PUBLIC COMMUNICATIONS</u>: Members of the public shall be allowed to address the Board of Supervisors on items not appearing on the agenda which are of interest to the public and are within the subject matter jurisdiction of the Board, provided that no action shall be

taken unless otherwise authorized by law. The total amount of time allotted for receiving such public communication shall be limited to a total of 15 minutes and each individual or group will be limited to no more than 5 minutes.

<u>AGENDA ITEMS</u>: The opportunity of the public to be heard on an item shall be provided during the consideration of that item. In the interest of time, the Board has limited the length of such comment or input on each item to 15 minutes total, with a limit of no more than 5 minutes per person or group. The period for public comments on a particular item may be extended upon a majority vote of the Board. These time limits do not apply to applicants appearing before the Board on behalf of their applications.

<u>ACTION ITEMS</u>: All items on the Agenda under the headings "Consent," "County Departments," Ordinances and Public Hearings," "Items of Public Interest," and "Closed Session," or any of them, are items on which the Board may take any action at this meetings.

<u>PUBLIC HEARINGS</u>: All members of the public shall be allowed to address the Board as to any item which is noticed on the Board's agenda as a public hearing. The Board has limited each person or group input to no more than 3 minutes. Any person or group may provide the Board with a written statement in lieu of or in supplement to any oral statement made during a public hearing. Written statements shall be submitted to the Clerk of the Board.

ORDINANCES: Ordinances shall not be passed within five days of their introductions, nor at other than a regular meeting or at an adjourned regular meeting. The Board of Supervisors will address ordinances at first readings. The public is urged to address ordinances at first readings. Passage of ordinances will be held at second readings, after reading the title, further reading is waived and adoption of the ordinance is made by majority vote. An urgency ordinance may be passed immediately upon introduction. The Board reserves the right to amend any proposed ordinances and to hold a first reading in lieu of a second reading.

<u>INFORMATIONAL CORRESPONDENCE</u>: The Board may direct any item of informational correspondence to a department head for appropriate action.

SCHEDULED LUNCH BREAK: Between the hours of 12:00 noon and 1:00 p.m. and at the discretion of the Chair, the Board will recess one hour for lunch.

SPECIAL MEETINGS: No public comment shall be allowed during special meetings of the Board of Supervisors, except for items duly noticed on the agenda.

FOR BIDS TO CONSTRUCT THE RUPERT AVE WIDENING PROJECT

RECOMMENDATION:

Approval of Plans and Specifications and authorize the subject project for advertisement of bids with a tentative bid opening date of November 6, 2012. The specifications are available for review at Public Works.

BACKGROUND:

A 1,600 foot segment of Rupert Avenue between Puddle Drive and Hammonton Smartsville Road is in substandard condition with regard to the pavement structural section and drainage facilities. To correct these deficiencies, Public Works secured partial funding through a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), with the remainder funded through East Linda Specific Plan Development fees.

DISCUSSION:


The project will entail reconstructing and widening the roadway to meet current design standards and will re-align the northern end of Rupert Avenue with Avondale Avenue and create a three-way stop. This project will also provide bike lanes, on-street parking, curbs, gutters, sidewalks and drainage facilities. The project is expected to be completed by October 30, 2013.

COMMITTEE ACTION:

The Land Use and Public Works Committee was bypassed as this project is included in the current Public Works budget.

FISCAL IMPACT:

Total construction costs are estimated at \$850,000. Three Hundred and fourteen thousand Dollars (\$314,000) is funded through the CDBG program with the remainder \$536,000 funded by the East Linda Specific Plan Development Fees.

Knife River Construction was awarded the contract for North Beale Road Shoulder Improvements and Overlay in the amount of \$1,345,847.30 on May 15, 2012. Actual construction cost was \$1,360,719.64. The project consisted of shoulder improvements and placing rubberized hot mix asphalt overlay on North Beale Road from Griffith Avenue to Beale Air Force Base in Yuba County.

DISCUSSION:

The Contractor has completed the work. Once the Board accepts the project as complete the Public Works Department will file a Notice of Completion with the Yuba County Recorder.

COMMITTEE ACTION:

The Land Use & Public Works Committee was bypassed as this project was included in the Public Works Budget, and the request is routine in nature.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The entire construction phase of this project, including construction engineering, was funded 88.53% through the RSTP and CMAQ programs and the remaining 11.47% was funded by the Road Fund.

_ MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN COUNTY OF YUBA AND YUBA COUNTY OFFICE OF EDUCATION

This Memorandum of Understanding is between the County of Yuba and the Yuba County Office of Education. Term of the agreement is September 1, 2012 through June 30, 2013.

- Yuba County Office of Education agrees to provide an educational program for probation clients at the Yuba County Probation Department between September 2012 and June 2013, consisting of a basic General Equivalency Degree (GED) education. In connection therewith, the Yuba County Office of Education shall provide a teacher and all materials and supplies required for such programs.
- 2. County of Yuba agrees to make one payment of \$9,000 to the Yuba County Office of Education, due January 1, 2013, and will be invoiced for the remainder of the costs based on actual cost of the program for continued services through June 30, 2013. The total amount of contribution from County of Yuba is estimated to not be more than \$12,000 for the year.
- 3. Full accounting is available for review annually.
- 4. If for any reason either party wishes to cancel this agreement, it must be in writing at least 90 days before the next fiscal year begins.
- 5. Indemnity. County of Yuba shall indemnify and hold harmless Yuba County Office of Education (and Yuba County Office of Education's officers, officials, employees, independent contractors, volunteers, and agents) from and against any and all claims, actions, and proceedings (including all costs, attorneys' fees, expenses, and liabilities incurred in the defense of any such claim, action, or proceeding brought thereon, relating to damage to property or injury to persons) caused by the performance or omission to perform under this Agreement by County of Yuba or County of Yuba's agents, representatives, employees, contractors and subcontractors.

Yuba County Office of Education shall indemnify and hold harmless County of Yuba (and County of Yuba's officers, officials, employees, independent contractors, volunteers, and agents) from and against any and all claims, actions, and proceedings (including all costs, attorneys' fees, expenses, and liabilities incurred in the defense of any such claim, action, or proceeding brought thereon, relating to damage to property or injury to persons) caused by the performance or omission to perform under this Agreement by Yuba County Office of Education or Yuba County Office of Education's agents, representatives, employees, contractors and subcontractors.

If any such claim, action, or proceeding is brought against an indemnified party or that party's officers, officials, employees, independent contractors, volunteers, or

agents, the indemnifying party, upon notice from the indemnified party, shall defend the same at the indemnifying party's expense by counsel satisfactory to the indemnified party.

Each party shall promptly notify the other party of any claim, action, or proceeding against that party or that party's officers, officials, employees, independent contractors, volunteers, or agents relating to the performance or omission to perform, any term or condition of this Agreement. The indemnified party shall cooperate fully in the defense of any such claim, action or proceeding.

6. The County of Yuba and Yuba County Office of Education certify that they are self insured with respect to this agreement in an amount adequate to provide coverage for any liability which may arise as a result of this Memorandum of Understanding.

Re: Elite Security price increase request

Recommendation

It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors consider the attached Cost of Living Adjustment request from Monty Hecker of Elite Security, for security services and directs the Purchasing Agent to execute a contract amendment for this change.

Background

In the fall of 2010, the County renewed its contract with Elite Security for uniformed physical security presence at County facilities. The contract agreed to a fixed hourly rate for services and did not include a cost escalator for annual or periodic increases. We further agreed to a maximum annual contract expense of \$314,580. We are currently averaging less than \$190,000 per year.

Discussion

Elite is asking for an increase of either \$.40 per hour or at least a cost of living increase. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, a COLA adjustment based on the start date of the contract to current would equal a 5% increase.

Committee Action

This item was reviewed by the Public Facilities Committee and is brought to the full Board without recommendation.

Financial Impact

The County currently pays a base rate of \$13.44/hour for security services. A 5% increase would equate to \$14.11/hour.

RECOMMENDATION:

It is recommended that the Board of Supervisors consider options for maintenance of Hammonton Road and provide direction / take action as appropriate.

BACKGROUND:

The maintenance issue of Hammonton Road has been discussed by your Board numerous times over the years. Recently, a group of citizens approached your Board with a request that the County perform maintenance on the road. Your Board directed staff to investigate the matter further and bring back options for consideration.

Currently, Hammonton Road is a public right of way, but is not a County-maintained road. The road is primarily gravel, heavily potholed, and has not been maintained in a decade; it receives very little traffic. It has been determined in the past that if the County were to perform maintenance on the road, by default it would become a County-maintained road.

DISCUSSION:

Staff discussed the matter of Hammonton Road and its maintenance, and has determined 3 potential options or paths forward. The 3 options are identified below followed by a brief discussion of each:

- A) Maintain the status quo.
- B) Turn Hammonton Road into a County-maintained road and perform the necessary repair work.
- C) Abandon the Hammonton Road right-of-way in which case the public will no longer have an interest in and can no longer use the road.

Option A is staff's recommended alternative and consists of leaving things as they are. This would entail doing no maintenance work to the road and continue posting notification at either end of the road that it is not a maintained road and travel on the road is at your own risk, and would not take away from the County's limited road maintenance resources. The down-side to this alternative is the road will continue to remain in poor condition, and eventually may become impassable with enough erosion from the river.

Option B entails the County repairing the road and continuing forward with its ongoing maintenance. This is an extremely expensive option and would divert limited resources away from other County-maintained roads in need of repair. Staff has estimated the cost to repair the existing road at \$1 million and ongoing maintenance at \$50,000 per year. There are already inadequate funds to maintain the County's other roads in a good state of repair. Diverting enough resources to handle Hammonton Road would exacerbate this problem and significantly hinder the County's maintenance of other roads; roads that are much more heavily travelled than Hammonton Road.

RECOMMENDATION

Approve the recommendation to amend the Position Allocation and Classification System -Basic Salary Schedules as they relate to the Probation Department, effective October 1, 2012.

BACKGROUND

The Probation Department upper management currently consists of a Chief Probation Officer and a Superintendent of Institutions. The Superintendent of Institutions is tasked with the administrative and daily oversight of the two bi-county Juvenile institutions. In July of 2011 the Superintendent of Institutions retired, creating a vacancy in the Probation department and an opportunity to study the departmental structure and needs.

DISCUSSION

The Probation Department has assessed its organizational needs to create a more efficient structure to meet growing demands. Concurrently, Human Resources conducted a survey of the Probation departments throughout the State of California and their organizational structure, salaries and qualification requirements. After discussions with the Probation Department and a review of the information gathered, Human Resources recommends establishing an Assistant Chief Probation Officer classification in order to mitigate the growing demands on the Chief Probation Officer. The Assistant Chief Probation Officer will focus on the operational side, including personnel matters and program management, thereby allowing the Chief Probation Officer to focus on overall department administration. and program direction and development.

Additionally, Human Resources recommends a re-title at the first-line management level to accurately reflect the duties and authority of these classifications. The Chief Probation Officer and Superintendent of Institutions currently oversee a management team of five consisting of three Probation Program Managers and two Deputy Superintendents. The Probation Program Managers are assigned to the community-based probation services and oversee a total of twenty-two Deputy Probation Officers, eleven Senior Deputy Probation Officers and three Supervising Deputy Probation Officers. The Deputy Superintendents are assigned to the bi-county institutions and oversee a total of twenty-four Group Counselors and seven Supervising Group Counselors. With the alteration of the department structure to include the Assistant Chief Probation Officer instead of a program-dedicated Superintendent of Institutions, the title of Deputy Superintendent is no longer intuitive. Human Resources recommends re-titling the Deputy Superintendents to Probation Program

Manager I to more accurately reflect their duties within the bi-county institutions and the reporting structure of the Department. Additionally, Human Resources recommends retitling the Probation Program Manager to Probation Program Manager II to maintain consistency. The Probation Program Manager I/II series will be alternatively staffed and future recruitments will require a competitive process to promote to the II level.

The attached Resolutions update the County position allocation and salary schedule.

COMMITTEE

This item has bypassed committee due to pressing staffing needs.

FISCAL IMPACT

There is no additional fiscal impact; monies were previously accounted for during the 2012/2013 budget cycle.

DISCUSSION

The Probation Department today faces many demands, including budget cuts, a relatively new management team, a depleted workforce, and massive legislative demands on when and how we operate; all of which can't be met under our current mode of operations and structure. When the Superintendent of Institutions retired I took the opportunity to examine what changes we could make to improve our efficiency and stabilize the department during this uncertain time.

Legislation affecting probation services has changed drastically over the last few years and is expected to continue to do so as more and more measures move though the legislative process. Probation as we knew it has changed forever.

The Public Safety Realignment Act (AB 109) significantly changed the criminal justice system and the future of the Probation Department. The State has shifted the responsibility of probation oversight for a large number of offenders to the County, drastically increasing our workload. Currently we are supervising an additional 115 clients as a direct result of this legislation and this number could increase to as many as 160 by the end of this calendar year. In contrast, our workforce has continued to shrink under increasing financial restrictions.

The California Community Corrections Performance Incentives Act (SB 678) requires probation departments to identify and track specific outcome-based measures, the performance and effectiveness of which will determine the level of funding provided to the agency. One of the many requirements is that the County must do case plans and assessments on all of our clients and requires an enormous amount of data to be collected, stored, analyzed and shared on the State level, all according to strict guidelines.


California Fostering Connections to Success Act (AB 12) extends foster care and other assistance for eligible youths beyond the current age of 18 until the age of 21. This not only increases the number of youths in the juvenile system but the requirements of the Act place an additional strain on the way their cases are managed in order to ensure the eligibility for these vital services. The long-lasting positive results from a long history of early intervention and prevention would be jeopardized if even one element is eliminated.

Many County Probation agencies have created managers specifically to oversee the implementation and administration of these bills. This is a luxury that Yuba County cannot afford and yet the financial risk of non-compliance, and the more important risk to public safety, is far too costly to entertain. It is imperative that this department focus its energies on programmatic management of the new legislations.

Currently, the Chief Probation Officer is performing the vast majority of the legislative monitoring, review and analysis related to these changes, as well as designing and managing the transition to the new performance measures, case management techniques and requirements. The Probation Program Managers and Deputy Superintendents have been assisting in this review when possible but it takes away from their daily program management and could result in the long-term in an impact on the effectiveness of our services. We cannot continue to function effectively under this model.

During this transitional period it became clear that the Managers in the Institutions division are fully capable of managing the responsibilities they are faced with, and that managerial oversight of these positions could be accomplish by other means. It is no longer necessary to dedicate an entire position to oversee just this function. It would be more efficient to have a managerial position which can oversee more functional areas and assist in the increased programmatic management demands. Adding this one classification is more efficient and fiscally conservative than establishing multiple positions to meet these increased demands.



RECOMMENDATION:

That the Land Use and Public Works Committee considers staff to apply for grant funds made available by First Five Yuba to prolong the successful Recreation Coordinator Program by funding the popular scholarship program for two additional years.

BACKGROUND:

The First Five Yuba Commission is currently soliciting proposals for programs supporting their strategic plan initiatives. It is staff's intent to submit a proposal to support the recreational scholarship program for 0-5 year olds, and their families, for two additional years.

DISCUSSION:

Having expired June 30, 2012, the First Five Yuba grant, which helped conceive the Yuba County Recreation Program, demonstrated that through collaboration seemingly insurmountable challenges can be overcome. True to its original intent, in four short years the grant was used to seed what has now become a self-sustained recreation program. Through partnerships, the County is able to offer programming to the community without subsidy from the general fund

If awarded an additional round of First Five Yuba funds, we will have the means to provide a foundation of programming for another generation of Yuba County children by offering scholarships to income dependent families. To measure the impact of this program, and the effect it has had on our community, staff has gleaned the following total attendance statistics from the past year of programming facilitated by Yuba County Recreation:

RECOMMENDATION:

Recommend approval to the Board of Supervisors for the application of a floodplain development variance for the agricultural storage building planned at 7388 Doc Adams Road, APN 018-340-017.

BACKGROUND:

The owners of 7388 Doc Adams Road, located west of SR 70, in District 10 are proposing to construct a concrete and steel agricultural building to support an existing farming operation. The new building will consist of a 650sf enclosed structure with a 500sf overhang. The building will be used to store tractors, hay and feed.

DISCUSSION:

Floodplain management regulations cannot be written to anticipate every imaginable situation. Yuba County Ordinance 10.30.090 "Variance Procedure" was adopted as a way to seek permission to vary from the letter of the rules because of a special situation. It is the Floodplain Manager's opinion that this is such a situation. The structure is for the storage and processing of an agricultural equipment and products. Requesting a variance for wet floodproofing this type of agricultural structure is one of the most common. It is specifically listed as allowable in the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP).

FISCAL IMPACT:

There is no fiscal impact to Yuba County.

I. What danger is there that materials may be swept onto other lands to the injury of others?

Little or none. The structure will be designed to automatically equalize the hydrostatic flood forces on exterior walls by allowing for the entry and exit of floodwaters via flood vents. The structure will be adequately anchored to prevent flotation, collapse, or lateral movement of the structure resulting from hydrodynamic and hydrostatic loads, including the effects of buoyancy.

- II. What danger to life and property may occur due to flooding or erosion damage?

 <u>Little or none.</u> The structure will be constructed using flood resistant materials and the project will not have utility services (electric, gas, water, sewer) to the proposed building.
- III. How susceptible is the proposed facility and its contents to flood damage and what effects will such damage have on the existing individual owner and future owners of the property?

This property is in the area being designated Flood Zone A due to the levee to the west not being certified by FEMA. Unless there is a levee failure there is little chance of flood damage. The National Flood Insurance Program allows certain uses in enclosures below the Base Flood Elevation because they can be designed so that they are subject to minimal flood damage. This storage structure is too be used exclusively for storing a tractor, hay and feed.

IV. What is the importance of the services provided by the proposed facility to the community?
The storage of equipment within the structure eliminates environments that create

safety hazards and preserve a minimum standard of community living by battling blight and public nuisance conditions. Maintain property values and increase generating continued County growth that will enhance the enjoyment of people who live, work and visit within the community. Agricultural equipment, hay and feed will be stored to reduce/eliminate weather damage and vandalism.

- V. What is the compatibility of the proposed use with existing and anticipated development? The type of storage being proposed is consistent and accessory to the principal use of the existing structures on this parcel and within the community.
- VI. What is the relationship of the proposed use to the comprehensive plan and floodplain management program for that area?

 This property is zoned A/RR-1. The type of storage being proposed is consistent with

the County's General Plan and zoning.

- VII. How will the property have safe access for ordinary and emergency vehicles in time of flood? Access to this community is provided by State Highway 70. This structure would not require additional response from emergency vehicles in time of flood.
- VIII. What is the expected height, velocity, duration, rate of rise, and sediment transport of the flood waters expected at the site?
 Flooding would only occur if levee fails. Historically a break in the levee occurred in 1937. In 1955, water reached the top of the levee, but did not overtop. In 1986 and 1997, water overtopped the levees on the south side of the district but did not affect the area in question.
- IX. What are the anticipated costs of providing governmental services during and after flood conditions, including maintenance and repair of public utilities and facilities such as sewer, gas, electrical, and water system, and streets and bridges?

 None for this structure. It is an accessory structure. In this rural agricultural community, the property owners own and maintain their own wells and septic systems. Electrical power is provided by Pacific Gas & Electric Co. and the State Highway provide access to the community.







RECOMMENDATION:

That the Land Use and Public Works Committee consider a five (5) year Lease Agreement with the Olivehurst Linda Little League for the use of their field in support of our Parks Master Pan in exchange for our assistance with critical facility improvements.

BACKGROUND:

In FY 2012 – 2013, the Community Development and Services Agency budgeted \$10,000 in improvements for the Olivehurst Linda Little League complex on Pasado Road. A component of this project is also the execution of a five (5) year lease which would allow the County free access for functions pursuant to its ongoing recreation program.

The scheduled improvements will include minor improvements into the facility and basic baseball field rehabilitation.

DISCUSSION:

The attached lease agreement with the Olivehurst Linda Little League will give the County free, unobstructed access to the facility when not otherwise occupied for Little League games for the purpose of expanding outdoor recreational programming into the Olivehurst and Linda areas as demand increases.

FISCAL IMPACT:

No additional fiscal impact as this is a budgeted item.

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
