Under the jurisdiction of the Superior Court, the Yuba County Public Guardian/Conservator provides mandated conservatorship and estate services for the elderly and individuals with disabilities within the community, as specified by the Probate and Welfare and Institutions Code.

- Expanded On-Call duties to include Deputy Public Guardian to cover at least one week per month or as needed
- Created a policy and procedure for 24-Hour Call

- Voted as vice chair of the APS (Adult Protective Services) Multidisciplinary Action Team
- Attended or participated in care conferences to discuss progress, issues/concerns, and appropriate placement of conservatees
- Secured funding through local resources

- Cleaned and organized department’s storage area
- Increased attendance to conservatees’ medical appointments
